Army Says MacArthur Is Free to Campaign

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Army ruled in effect that Gen. Douglas MacArthur is not subject to regulations banning political activity by members of the armed forces.

The Army didn't mention MacArthur by name, but it issued a statement discussing the status of five-star generals which made MacArthur's status clear.

The Army said when "officers holding this rank are not assigned any duties, they are considered to be in status similar to retired officers and, therefore, not subject to the prohibitions of A.R. 600-10 relating to political activities."

MacArthur's status had been widely discussed since he was selected as keynote speaker for the Republican national convention in Chicago next month. The five-star general has openly supported Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio for the Republican presidential nomination.

MacArthur has remained on the Army's active list but has not been assigned any specific duties since his ouster by President Truman as Far Eastern commander.

The ruling apparently means that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower could have remained on the active list while campaigning for the Republican nomination.

Thus Eisenhower could have continued to receive — like MacArthur — the \$19,341.84 annual pay of a five-star general. Both would have been five-star generals without specific duties.

But Eisenhower retired from the active list and gave up his pay when he launched his open drive for the Republican crown.

Man Admits Ax Killing

THE DALLES, Ore. (AP)—Albert William Karnes, 24, admitted in a signed statement late Tuesday night that he hacked an 81-year-old Salem widow to death and stole \$30, police here reported.

Clyde Warren, Salem police chief, said Karnes had dictated and signed a confession.

Karnes, of no fixed address but generally living at Astoria, was arrested here June 11 on a charge of burglary and assault with a hammer on Mrs. Ben Callaway.

Warren came here Tuesday to question Karnes because of what appeared to be a similarity in the attack on Mrs. Callaway and the June 7 ax slaying of Mrs. Susan Litchfield in Salem.

Warren reported that Karnes—a former roomer at Mrs. Litchfield's house—sided in his statement that the slaying occurred this way:

He went to the Litchfield home June 6 to look for his former wife. He did not locate her but returned the next day and found Mrs. Litchfield in a woodshed near her home.

He hacked her to death with an ax and later took the money from her purse. He then went to the bathroom of Mrs. Litchfield's

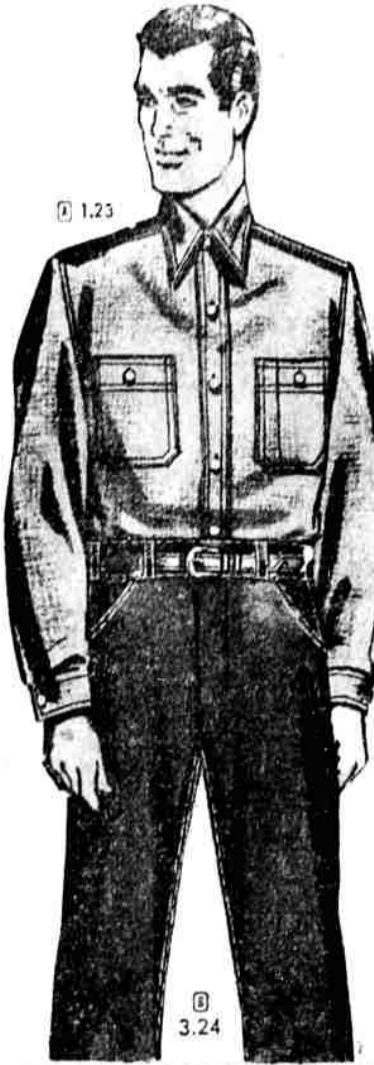
