Libel Bill Due For Radio-TV

WASHINGTON — A bill to safeguard radio and television stations from libel suits based on broadcasts of political candidates went to a Senate-House conference Wednesday.
The legislation also would prevent the stations from charging candidates hiked-up rates.
And the House, in passing the measure by voice vote late Tuesday required that if a station sells time to one candidate it must make equal time available to his opponents.
One provision, offered by Rep. Horan (R-Wash.), specifies that stations may not censor the contents of political speeches.
The House refused by voice vote to knock out of the measure a provision which would prohibit discrimination against newspaper publishers seeking radio licenses.
Some lawmakers said this might give newspapers preferred status. Others said it would only put publishers on an equal footing with other applicants.
Except for Horan's amendment, which was approved by a 92 to 27 standing vote, the House measure is similar to one passed by the Senate to revise the federal communication law.
House debate on the complicated bill focused on campaign speeches expected to crowd the airways during the summer.
The Federal Communication Commission's present policy already says radio and TV stations cannot censor speeches by political candidates and cannot be held liable for what the candidates say. But some broadcasters, fearing they might be sued anyway, asked for a specific law.

Last Chief Dies at 80

PENDLETON — Jim Ka-ni-ne, 80, last of the traditional Indian chiefs on the Umatilla reservation, died in St. Anthony's hospital here Tuesday night of cancer.
He became chief of the Walla Walla in 1917 and there will be no chief to succeed him, Richard Butts, agency supervisor, said.
In 1946 Red Hawk of the Cayuse tribe and Jim Billy of the Umatilla died, and that left Ka-ni-ne the last of the chiefs.
He spoke little English.
His widow, Charlotte Davis Ka-ni-ne, survives. Funeral services will be held Friday morning at the Tutuilla Presbyterian church, which he attended occasionally, eight miles east of here.

Bike Riders Set For Show
Hundreds of Klamath Falls bike riders will parade through town at 10:30 a.m. Friday on elaborately decorated bikes in the Bike Safety Parade sponsored by Montgomery Ward and Co.
The parade begins at 10:30 in front of the Court House and will travel from there to Tenth Street to the Wards Store where prizes will be awarded to the riders of the best and most originally decorated bike.
Judging the bike decorations will be Mayor Bob Thompson, Recreation Director Bob Bonney and Chamber Manager Frank Tucker.
Howard Stroud, Wards store manager and chairman of the Bike Safety Campaign, said today, "We expect more than 2000 people to take the parade route to watch the greatest bike parade Klamath Falls has ever seen. Everyone should be sure to see just how much fun and safety knowledge our town's bike riders get from such a campaign."
Every rider in the parade will get free Coca-Cola, furnished by the Coca-Cola Bottling Co. of Klamath Falls. Valuable prizes topped by a G. E. Sealed Beam bicycle will go to the winners.
The parade is the climax of a two-week Bike Safety campaign to make Klamath Falls the "safest cycling city in the United States."
Chuck Smith, manager of Wards sporting goods, who still will take entries until 5:30 tonight, gave a summary of the most important safety regulations. The dozen "Do's" and "Don'ts" for careful biking are:

- 1. Do keep your bicycle in excellent running condition by checking wheels, brakes, chains and tires.
- 2. Don't stunt or race in traffic.
- 3. Do obey all traffic signs and signals before making turns. Keep to the right.
- 4. Don't hitch onto moving vehicles.
- 5. Do walk your bikes across busy intersections.
- 6. Don't carry passengers on your handlebars or fenders.
- 7. Do ride single file when with a group of cyclists.
- 8. Don't make repairs on the roadway. If repairs are necessary, make them at the side of the highway.
- 9. Do attach a basket or rack for carrying parcels, freeing both hands for steering except when signaling.
- 10. Don't shoot out of blind driveways.
- 11. Do have a headlight and rear reflector for night driving and a bell or horn at all times.
- 12. Don't forget—use your head and you're sure to keep it.
