

### Kiwanis Pass Resolutions

SEATTLE (AP)—Kiwanis International, heading into the final day of its five-day 37th annual convention, wrote into its records a hard hitting resolution calling for freedom of information in this country.

The resolution was one of 19 adopted by the 10,000 delegates Wednesday after electing Walter J. L. Ray, Detroit, as new president.

New York City also was without opposition in its bid for the 1953 convention.

In a direct slap at President Truman's order last year empowering federal agencies to classify their own information on security grounds, the resolution said Kiwanis International "demands the right of freedom of information as continued as a fundamental right of all the people."

It said "some public officials feel they are not accountable to the public, particularly in the handling of information of non-defense departments; that they may conduct the business of their offices in secret; that they may seal or incommunicado public records; that they may divulge only such information as they think is good for the people to know; and that they may extend militaristic security into areas which have no bearing on that security."

The resolution said further that Kiwanis International "vigorously condemns all such practices and denounces the misuse of official influence and power."

A controversial resolution on universal military training was referred back to the resolutions committee for action next year.

### Foot-Mouth Lab Set Up

WASHINGTON (AP)—Communities usually clamor for 10-million-dollar federal projects but the Senate approved one Wednesday the government may have trouble finding a home for.

The sum was approved for a laboratory to investigate foot and mouth and other animal diseases. Some places already mentioned as sites have expressed downright hostility.

To prevent the laboratory from being located where it isn't wanted, the Senate bill provides the site must be approved by both Senate and House Agriculture Committees and by the governor of the state involved.

Sen. Mundt (R-S.D.), a sponsor of the project, said adequate safeguards will be taken to keep the laboratory from spreading the dread foot and mouth disease.

The last outbreak in this country occurred in California during the 1920's. But an outbreak in Mexico and another more recently in Canada have spread alarm among U. S. cattlemen.

### Quads Born In Massachusetts

WEYMOUTH, Mass. (AP)—Mrs. Marion L. Manning, 27, is the proud mother of healthy quadruplets.

The quadruplets—three boys and a girl—were born at South Shore hospital Wednesday night to Mrs. Manning, already the mother of three other youngsters.

The babies, all placed in incubators, were reported to weigh between 2 and 3 pounds each and to measure about a foot long. Several hours after the last birth, hospital physicians reported their conditions as "fair."

All four deliveries were described as normal by Dr. Robert R. Ryan who delivered the babies with the assistance of Dr. Edward J. Howley.

Mrs. Manning had been waiting for the births at the hospital for nearly four weeks, taking the advice of her husband, John, a 35-year-old bus line operator, who explained he did not want to risk a premature arrival without medical attention.

The infants, due Aug. 15, were nearly two months premature, but physicians explained that such multiple births rarely go full term.

The Manning family now numbers four boys and three girls. The older children, Dennis, 4; Mary Alice 3; and Anne Marie, 2, are living temporarily with relatives.

According to medical sources quadruplets occur once in every 680,000 births.

### Killer Gets 15 Year Term

THE DALLES (AP)—A 15-year prison sentence was meted Wednesday to Alfred William Karnes, 23, who police say has confessed the slaying of a Salem woman.

Karnes pleaded guilty to a charge of burglary and assaulting with a hammer Mrs. Ben Callaway here June 10, three days after Mrs. Susan Litchfield, 81, was hacked to death in the woods of her Salem home.

Circuit Judge Malcolm W. Wilkinson sentenced Karnes, an Astoria farm worker, to the maximum prison term.

District Attorney E. O. Stadler Jr. said in Salem he would file a first degree murder charge against Karnes in Mrs. Litchfield's death. Salem Police Chief Clyde Warren said Karnes signed a confession that he killed Mrs. Litchfield June 7 and robbed her of \$30.
