O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.), piloting the 46-billion-dollar military appropriations bill through the Senate, said the defense program could be advanced a year by adding \$3,600,000,000 to the nearly six billions cash the bill would provide to expand the Army, Navy and Air Force.
