 LONDON (AP) — R. A. Butler, chancellor of the exchequer, gave British bicycle bell makers a tip Wednesday on how to sell in the American market.
 "Make the bells a little bigger and a little noisier than the ones for the home market."
 Butler told the National Union of Manufacturers one small bicycle bell maker adopted that as his motto and is doing very well.
 The chancellor said that in Britain's all-out attempt to earn much-needed dollars "that sort of enterprise will bring success."

Fire Destroys Food Store
 PORTLAND (AP) — Fire at 2 a.m. Wednesday destroyed the Tony's Food Market building at the Oregon end of the Interstate Bridge. The owners said loss of merchandise and equipment was \$175,000. In the building were a grocery store, a meat and fruit stand and a bakery. An adjacent drug and variety store was damaged.
 Concrete walls were all that remained of the block-long market building owned by Hayden Island Enterprises, Inc. Anthony A. Marchionelli, owner of the market, said his loss was \$160,000 including \$12,000 in cash burned up. Most of it was insured.
 Damage to the adjacent building

was estimated at \$15,000. Residents of an adjacent 50-house village used fire hoses to save their homes.
 Cause was not determined. Marchionelli said there usually was a night watchman on duty, but last night was his night off.

New Purchase Agent Named

Reds Cancel Truce Talks

 MUNHAI, Korea (AP) — The stalled Korean armistice talks are in recess for 24 hours at Communist request. The Reds gave no reason for asking cancellation of Wednesday's session, but the U. N. command immediately agreed.
 The recess came just one day after Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison Jr., painstakingly reviewed the April 28 Allied plan for exchanging war prisoners, and suggested that it offers the Communists a face-saving way to end the long stalemate.
 There was no indication whether the Reds were re-studying their demand that all Allied-held prisoners be sent home or were drafting their own proposal for presentation Thursday.
 The prisoner issue is the main block to an armistice. The Allies refuse to return prisoners who do not want to go home. The Reds want all military captives back.
 Some observers here speculated that the Communists are studying carefully Harrison's lengthy review of the prisoner problem. In effect, the chief U. N. truce negotiator told the Reds the Allies would erase from their prisoner lists about 100,000 captives who say they will resist repatriation.
 This would leave 70,000 to 80,000 Reds to be returned when an armistice is signed.
 Harrison suggested that the U. N. plan would meet Communist specifications since war prisoners who refuse repatriation would be given some other classification and removed from the official roster.
 The Reds then would get back
