Bishop Levels Ad Accusation

PORTLAND — A charge that the Oregon Kennel Club was using misleading radio advertising in its campaign to preserve the state racing law was made Wednesday by Methodist Bishop Gerald Kennedy. Kennedy said three Portland radio stations had carried a statement quoting George F. Gordon, identified as a Methodist minister at Aloha, as saying that "many religious leaders do not share in the reformers' zeal to make horse racing and dog racing a crime, and that dog racing was "one of the cleanest and most honest" of sports.

Kennedy said that Gordon left the church 17 years ago following a dispute with church officials in its breeding of racing dogs. Kennedy added that there was not a Methodist church in Aloha. The Methodists have been active, along with other denominations, in the Oregon Council of Churches' initiative to ban race betting. Bishop Kennedy demanded a retraction of the radio advertisement and said they were designed to mislead the public and give wrong the wrong impression as to religious leaders' stand on the racing ban.

Bribe Brings Jail To Three

SAN FRANCISCO — The Ninth U. S. Court of Appeals upheld the sentences of three men convicted of plotting to put a wealthy prisoner on a prison farm instead of a federal penitentiary. The court ruled Wednesday that a "reading of the record leaves the distinct... impression... that a man of wealth here benefited from a crime and the selection of his place of confinement has been placed in the hands of designing men desirous of obtaining some of the prisoner's...". The convicted three and their sentences were: Edward J. Carrigan, 50, former deputy U. S. marshal for Northern California, five years and \$5,000 fine; Raymond Calmes, 47, former deputy U. S. marshal, Oakland, two years and \$3,000 fine; Jack Reynolds, 50, Oakland labor and political leader, three years and \$3,000 fine. The prisoner is Phil Davis, sentenced to prison after his yacht ran over Imogene Wittesche in Lake Tahoe, causing her to suffer the loss of parts of both legs. Testimony of the trio's trial said a \$2,000 bribe was paid to have Davis placed on the Santa Rita prison farm in Alameda County, Calif., instead of McNeil Island (Wash.) Federal Penitentiary.

4-Year-Old Hit By Car

A 4-year-old boy, Bruce Baldi of McCloud, Calif., apparently was unhurt Wednesday afternoon when he was hit by a car at 6th and Main. Mrs. Richard Baldi, the boy's mother, said she and the boy were crossing the street when a car turned the corner and struck the youngster, knocking him down. The car stopped and a woman got out, asked if he was hurt, and then left.

Workers began making alterations on the building housing the Klamath Falls branch of the First National Bank of Portland last week which will result in improved convenience for customers of the bank, it was reported by R. H. Tisdale, branch manager.

Improvements to be made at the First National building include installation of new inner and outer full length Herculex glass doors at the main entrance, construction of two new conference rooms inside the bank and at either side of the main entrance, installation of a completely new acoustical ceiling, new recessed incandescent lighting and extension of the office area on both sides of the bank.

Existing windows in the North and South mezzanine will be completely removed and the walls will be replastered in panels similar to those on the East wall. On the completion of the alterations the entire quarters will receive a new paint job in attractive colors.

ACHESON IN BRAZIL
RECIPE — U. S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson arrived in Brazil Wednesday for a state visit. He flew here from Vienna in the presidential plane Independence.

The mining owners have claimed for years that there should be some restitution on the part of the government for damages which they suffered through the closing order. But many of them failed to file claims within the established time limits.

Now, Congress has passed and sent to the President a bill which would permit them to bring suit in the court of claims regardless of any statute of limitations. The intent of order L-208 was to force a shift of gold miners to other mines which were producing strategic metals for the war effort. As to the purpose and the actual effect of the order, the House Judiciary Committee said: "The records of the War Production Board show that the gold mining industry was selected as a guinea pig to test the policy of shutting down so-called nonessential industries during the war. The issuance of the order was based upon dubious if not nonexistent authority."

The order failed completely to make any substantial contribution to the war effort and inflicted ruinous costs on the gold mining industry. No similar order was issued against any other industry in the nation during the war years.

Of the delay in filing claims, the committee said: "It must be noted that the great majority of mine operators affected by the order were the small operators who were mining in many out-of-way places and did not have the facilities to employ legal staffs to keep them informed of their possible rights."
