McCarran Asks For More Red Inquiries

WASHINGTON (AP)—Chairman McCarran (D-Nev.), said Thursday the Senate Internal Security subcommittee may investigate possible Communist infiltration of the Treasury Department and other government fiscal agencies.

The group's 18-month probe of the Institute of Pacific Relations (IPR), McCarran said, brought out evidence of Communist penetration of the Treasury Department during the war.

The Internal Security unit turned in a report to the Senate Wednesday charging that Communists and pro-Communists took control of the IPR and influenced U.S. policies in the Far East.

The report accused Owen Lattimore, a Far Eastern affairs specialist and Johns Hopkins University professor, and John P. Davies Jr., a State Department official.

Lattimore said the accusations were untrue and the call for perjury action "fantastic."

Davies, now deputy director of political affairs for the U.S. at Bonn, said in Germany he "certainly" denied the perjury allegations.

McCarran said the recommendations to investigate the Treasury and other money-handling agencies grew out of testimony linking the late Harry Dexter White, former undersecretary of the Treasury, and Solomon Adler, another former Treasury Department official, with a wartime Soviet espionage ring here.

The testimony was given by Elizabeth Bentley, a self-acknowledged former courier for the Communist underground.

She described White as one of the ring's best avenues for placing persons in strategic government jobs.

McCarran said the subcommittee did not pursue this in its IPR inquiry because it was outside the scope of the investigation.

House Oks Money Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House Interior passed a compromise \$541,729,845 interior department money bill Thursday and sent it to the Senate for final action.

The measure, agreed upon by a conference committee Wednesday, was \$90,421,955 below budget estimates for the year which began July 1.

A major feature of the bill is a provision for starting 10 new reclamation projects at an initial cost of nearly fifteen million dollars.

Of the total, \$2,350,000 would be spent in the Pacific Northwest. The projects are:

Minidoka, north side pumping division, \$150,000.

Savage Rapids Dam, Ore., \$700,000.

Yakima, Kennewick Division, Wash., 1 1/2 million.

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Tax Repeal On Ballot

SALEM (AP)—The proposed constitutional amendment to abolish the weight-mile tax on trucks was ordered on the November election ballot Thursday, as the trucking industry filed completed initiative petitions bearing 59,192 names.

The total was more than twice the required number of 26,286 signatures.

Thursday was the last day for filing completed initiatives.

Others filed earlier this week would require the state to stay on standard time, permit sale of liquor by the drink, and abolish pari-mutuel betting on horse and dog racing.

Three or four more initiatives were expected to be filed before the end of the day.

The 1951 Legislature passed a law to increase weight-mile taxes on trucks. The truckers got this referred to the people, and it also will be on the November ballot.

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
