Christian Education Leader Takes Over

Born and raised in the Philippines, Japanese prisoner of war for over two years, graduate of the University of Montana and the San Francisco Theological Seminary and now director of Christian education for Klamath Falls' First Presbyterian Church, that's Helen MacDonald.

This attractive young woman assumed her post here late last month after being graduated from the seminary at San Anselmo. She is in charge of the First Presbyterian Church School, Junior church and allied youth activities.

Miss MacDonald's parents, Dr. and Mrs. Kenneth P. MacDonald, were both pioneer missionaries in the Philippines. They recently retired from that work and are now making their home in Montana.

Dr. MacDonald went to the islands in 1909. In 1922, a young woman missionary went to the islands and she later became Mrs. MacDonald.

Helen is one of five children. She has two older sisters and two brothers.

In the spring of 1942, with Helen's sisters already in this country attending college, the rest of the MacDonald family made ready to come to America also. But they were caught by the war.

FLIGHT

So swift was the Japanese invasion, that the MacDonalds, some other missionaries and a few friends, natives had to flee their home in Philippine city of Legaspi and take to the hills.

For seven months, the little band of 17 fugitives from the Japanese lived the native life in mountain huts. Their introduction to the crude life was aided by two native girls who had been Mission Bible School students and had fled to the mountains with the missionaries.

A native friendly to the Japs finally revealed the mountain hide-out to the enemy and the missionaries and their native friends were captured.

At first, the MacDonalds were kept in house confinement in Manila. Then in July of 1944, they were transferred to the Los Banos prison camp, some 50 miles southeast of Manila.

Miss MacDonald says there were few instances of actual physical punishment meted out by the Japanese captors. But food was scarce and for a while, the prisoners received only about 400 calories daily.

"That," Helen explained with a soft smile, "is the amount of breakfast I was allowed a short time ago while on a reducing diet."

CLOSE GUARD

There was virtually no chance of escape from Los Banos. For one thing, it was behind the Japanese lines. And for another, the camp was ringed by menacing Japanese gun emplacements.

But on the night of Feb. 22, 1945, U.S. planes appeared and knocked out most of the Jap gun positions. Early the next morning, 120 Allied parachute troops were dropped into the camp and soon afterwards, Allied amphibians appeared on the lake adjoining the prison camp. The 1200 prisoners in the camp were all freed and taken around the Japanese lines by water.

The MacDonalds finally got back to this country and Helen entered the University of Montana. Helen entered college as a music major. It wasn't until she was well into her Freshman year that she decided to make church work her career.

However, she continued through the university studying music and was graduated with a degree in music education.

QUALIFICATIONS

With that music degree to support her theological education, she is admirably prepared for her present work in Christian education.

At the First Presbyterian here, Helen has the advantage of the church's new education building which was completed only about a year ago.

The educational building is the first unit of the proposed new church. The main auditorium unit, yet to be constructed, will offer additional education facilities.

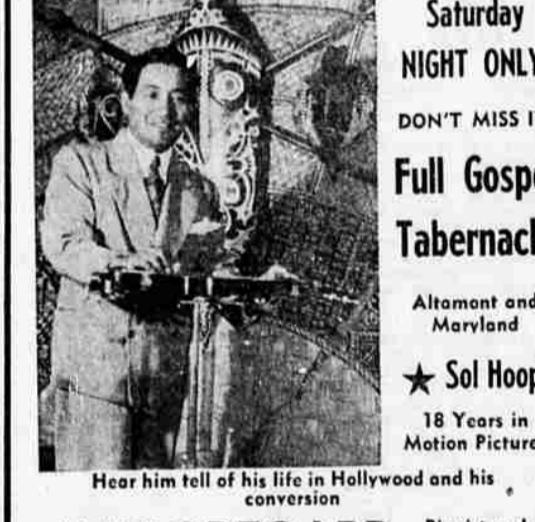
Miss Reed is something of a pioneer in her field here and it will be interesting to note how she organizes and conducts her work.

The church is not a gallery for the exhibition of eminent Christians but a school for the education of imperfect men, a nursery for the care of weak ones, a hospital for the healing of those who need assistance here.
