Trial Set In Lattimore Case

SEATTLE (AP)—Federal Judge William J. Lindberg Monday set Sept. 16 as the date of the trial of Harry A. Jarvinen, Seattle travel agency executive indicted in the Owen Lattimore false tip case. Jarvinen is named in two counts of a federal grand jury indictment as the source of information used by the State Department as the basis of its order prohibiting Lattimore, John Hopkins University professor and Far Eastern expert, from leaving the country. The Federal Bureau of Investigation later determined the information was false.

BIG THREE TO REPLY

PARIS (AP)—French foreign minister Robert Schuman told the National Assembly Tuesday the Big Three's reply to the Soviet proposal for a four-power conference on Germany is to be sent this week and probably will be published Thursday.

Hearings On Gas Recessed

WASHINGTON (AP)—Hearings on applications of five U.S. firms for permission to sell Canadian gas in Washington, Oregon and other Northwest states were recessed indefinitely Monday. The action was taken by Power Commission examiner Glenn Law after hearing lawyers battle more than three hours over proposals by Pacific Northwest interests to tap Canada's natural gas reserves. The commission during the recess will consider a motion by Alvin Kurtz, the commission's staff counsel, to throw out all the applications because he says Canada has not authorized any of the companies to export gas.
