100 Years Ago Recalled At Shedd Reunion

A family reunion that dated back 100 years took Klamath County families to Shedd, Oregon, June 29. The reunion was in memory of the arrival on that date in 1852, of the grandparents of Mrs. W. V. Whitlatch of the Merrill highway, Nicholas and Maria Bird Sprenger, who made the long trek via wagon train from Iowa to Oregon City and then to Albany. Both are buried at Corvallis.

Original plans called for the meeting to be held on the exact spot where they first touch Oregon soil but rain drove the 150 descendants to a high school gymnasium.

There are 260 descendants the oldest at the time of the reunion being 85-years-old, the youngest being four days. They live in Nevada, Utah, California and Oregon. This was the first reunion.

Several mementoes of those early days were on display and each one attending were presented with a portion of the material from the original three-room cabin the pioneers built and occupied.

The old homestead still is in possession of two grandsons, cousins H. G. Sprenger and Thomas R. Sprenger.

Nine grandchildren were present, including Mrs. Lena Sprenger Pugh, Shedd, J. W. Sprenger, Shedd Mrs. Max Hoelick, Albany, H. G. Sprenger Shedd, Mabel Ruitter, Eugene, Mrs. W. V. (Thelma) Whitlatch, Klamath Falls, Ethel Commons, Halsey, Thomas R. Sprenger, Shedd, Isabelle Wilson, Albany. Two other granddaughters, Mrs. Ellen Parker, 85, Oakland, Calif., and Mrs. Mack Doughton, Salem, were unable to attend.

RASPBERRY PARFAIT PIE
1 pkg. Raspberry Gelatin
1-2 cups hot water
1 Tbsp. Lemon Juice
1 pint Vanilla Ice Cream
1 cup Crushed Raspberries
1 9 inch pie shell
Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Add lemon juice. Add the ice cream by spoonfuls stirring until melted. Chill until thickened but not set. Fold in drained crushed raspberries. (Use juice as part of liquid.) Pour into pie shell which may be pastry, crumb or wafer—all are good with this pie. Chill until firm. Spread layer of whipped cream over top or garnish with whipped cream and fresh raspberries.

KEEP
Use wax paper or cellophane to cover berries and all fruits after placing them on a platter. They will keep for days in perfect condition in a gas refrigerator.
