

### City Council Turns Down Paving Bids

The City Council last night rejected the Asphalt Paving Company bid of \$51,100 for street patching and repair work planned for this summer and directed Engineer E. A. (Taxi) Thomas to re-advertise to get new bids by July 21.

Bids on the repair work were originally opened June 16, and only two firms offered prices — the local company and K. F. Jacobson of Portland.

The Jacobson bid was over \$58,000.

At the same time, bids on five local street paving jobs were opened and the Asphalt Paving Company was low on all five, although the bid prices exceeded previous estimates of the cost made by Engineer Thomas by from 16 to 18 per cent.

**CONTRACTS**

Last Monday night the company was awarded contracts for three of the street paving jobs — on Painter, Lowell and Lawrence — since property owners who have to pay for the work signified they were willing to go ahead with the jobs at the bid price.

Asphalt Paving Company's bids were:

Painter \$9,394.25 Lawrence \$17,533.75 Lowell \$11,013.87.

However, property owners on Pleasant and California avenues objected to the bid prices for improvements slated on those streets.

Asphalt Paving Company's bid on the Pleasant avenue job was \$15,829.85 and on the California job \$14,409.50. So far those bids have been neither accepted or rejected.

**15 PERCENT**

The Pleasant bid was just short of 15 per cent over the engineer's estimate, and the California bid more than 17 per cent higher.

The Pleasant street improvement may be doomed for this year, but Councilman Wendell Smith is attempting to work out some sort of deal to get the California paving done. The job consists of one 18-foot lane between Upham and Delta. The other lane of the divided street is already paved.

Because California is something of a thoroughfare, a major thorough street in that part of town and heavily traveled, Smith wants to arrange for the city to help out with the paving cost, spending on it some of the money the city receives from state gasoline tax revenue.

**MONEY USE**

That money generally is used for street work, repairs, cleaning and the like, but the practice here has been not to use any of it for initial paving.

However, an exception was made last year when the city surfaced N. 3rd at its own expense.

Smith says that such an expenditure is strictly legal, and has information that other cities in Oregon have assisted in street paving jobs that way.

As for the street patching work, the Asphalt Paving Company bid was almost 11 per cent higher than the engineer's estimate of the cost of the work, and the Council feels it may be able to make a saving by calling for bids again. The work can be accomplished in a few weeks.

Here again Smith obtained information from other cities showing that bid prices for various materials to be used in the work were higher than the price of similar materials paid by other cities.

### British Spy Gets 5 Years

LONDON (AP) — William Marshall, a radio operator for the British Foreign Office, was convicted Thursday of spying for Russia and sentenced to five years imprisonment.

The 24-year-old Marshall, who said he was a "mole" in the British embassy in Moscow when he was stationed there, declared "I am still innocent."

Judge Sir Patrick Barry pronounced the sentence after a two-day trial in Old Bailey, the court where German-born Klaus Fuchs was sentenced to 14 years imprisonment two years ago for giving atomic secrets to Russia.

A jury had recommended "ultra-maximum leniency" for Marshall, who could have been sentenced to a maximum of 14 years on each of four counts.

"We feel he has been led astray," said the jury.
