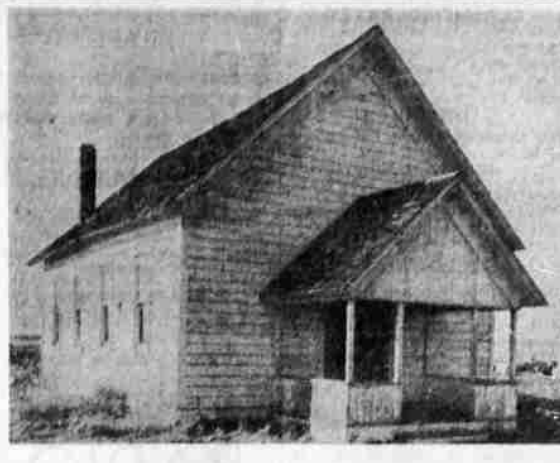

# New Building To Replace Historic Mt. Laki Church

Cornerstone laying ceremonies for the new Mt. Laki Community church at the Merrill highway and Midland Road, are planned for Sunday, July 13, 3 p.m. PST.

The hollow-tile building with sanctuary, Sunday School rooms, pastor's study, ladies' parlor, kitchen, and warmed by radiant heat will cost between \$55,000 and \$60,000. Van Landrum was the architect and construction is by Schortgen.

The construction marks the realization of plans for a modern sanctuary that dates back to November 1, 1908, when a small group of worshippers gathered at the Spring Lake schoolhouse to organize a Presbyterian church.

The memory of a Henry boy, who will be commemorated in the chapel of the church which is being built by the family of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Semon as a memorial to their son Charles who lost his life in World War II.

The names of all boys of the Mt. Laki and Henley communities who did not return from the war will be placed on a plaque. The list will include Charles Semon, James McKeehan, Robert Cameron, Lloyd Barnes and Robert Hamilton.

Donations from local residents will build the educational unit where Sunday School classes will be held.

The pipe organ has been given by Karl and Clyde Dehlinger in memory of their mother, the late Mrs. S. P. (Freida) Dehlinger.

Rev. Arthur L. Rice, pastor of the church has arranged the program which will include the early history of the church by Mrs. Minnie Grizzle; later events in growth of the church, Mrs. J. A. Fairclough; board of elders, Earl Mack; board of trustees, Ralph Hill; "What It Means to the Sunday School," Mrs. Earl Mack; the Ladies Aid, Mrs. Roy LaPrairie; the Senior Christian Endeavor, Burt Mack; the Junior Christian Endeavor, Jeffrey Lee.

"What It Means to the Community," Henry Semon; remarks, chairman of the building committee, Sam Enman; dedication of the cornerstone, Rev. Arthur L. Rice; laying of the cornerstone, Mrs. Earl Mack.

Mrs. J. D. Finchum will sing a solo, "The Church by the Side of the Road," the Senior and Junior choirs will sing; Mrs. Duane Blackman will sing, "Build This House," and Don Johnson will sing "The Lord's Prayer." Prayers and benediction will be by the pastor.

Assisting with the organization of that first church were Rev. George T. Pratt, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Klamath Falls and Rev. Louis Anderson, pastor of the Merrill Presbyterian church after authorization by the Presbytery.

There were 11 charter members, Mr. and Mrs. J. G. Stevenson, Mr. and Mrs. D. Addison Sr., Mrs. A. L. LaPrairie, Rex LaPrairie, Ray LaPrairie, and Florence M. Short.

J. G. Stevenson was installed as the first Elder.

John Koontz donated the land on the Southwest corner of his homestead and Stevenson solicited the money that built the little frame church now being replaced. Much of the work on the structure was donated.

The church was incorporated, March 11, 1909.

March 20, 1912, the first fulltime pastor, Rev. Louis Anderson was called by the congregation. Mrs. Koontz taught the first Sunday School class and was president of the Ladies Aid for many years.

Student pastors and laymen filled the pulpit in successive years. One of the most active was David A. McComb. Mt. Laki, who traveled with horse and buggy, on foot and horseback as a home missionary for many years.

Present officers are, Elders — Earl Mack, Roy L. LaPrairie, Mrs. J. L. O'Donahue, Trustees—W. M. Williams, Scott Thompson, Ralph Hill, Don Johnson, Fred Beumer, Mrs. Earl Mack is Sunday School Superintendent, Burt Mack is president of the Senior Christian Endeavor, Jeffrey Lee of the Junior CE, Mrs. J. L. O'Donahue is choir director.

Original plans called for completion of the building by early September but delays now make the time indefinite.
