Produce Prices Increase In Latest AP Tabulation

Retail prices of top grade eggs went up sharply in many stores this week. Butter also was higher. Several fresh fruits and vegetables were a little cheaper, reflecting abundant supplies.

Changes in meat prices were scattered and irregular, with reductions largely confined to special mark-downs to attract customers. There was little uniformity in these specials. Most frequently mentioned by leading chains and independent markets were: frying chickens, sirloin and porterhouse steaks, top and bottom round roasts, boneless chuck pot roast, rib roasts, fresh and frozen fish and lobster. Some stores continued to stress such picnic items as frankfurters, boiled ham and cold cuts.

Top grade eggs advanced as much as 12 cents a dozen over last week. Dealers blamed a loss of production and storage difficulties because of hot weather, heavy resort demand and increased buying by the military.

Butter rose a penny or two a pound in many sections, reflecting a seasonal downturn in production and a bigger diversion of milk to fluid channels. Demands for milk by the ice cream makers was reported exceptionally heavy. Butter storage stocks were below those of a year ago.

Most summertime fruits still topped the produce bargain lists in widespread marketing areas. Seedless grapes, for example, were less than half of last week's price at the wholesale level in some places. Blueberries and raspberries were at the peak of their season in quality and quantity. Cherries were plentiful.

Also lower as a rule this week: watermelons, cantaloupes, peaches (though most markets still had only early varieties), grapefruit and apricots. Lemons were a little lower but another spell of exceptionally hot weather over large areas would send their prices soaring again, produce men said.

Summer squash was abundant

and low-priced. Snap beans, carrots, celery, cucumbers, lettuce, peas and tomatoes also were lower. Many stores reported slightly higher prices this week on cauliflower, artichokes (which is about through for the season), cabbage, mushrooms, oranges and plums.

State GOPs In Active Role

CHICAGO (AP) — Oregon's delegation at the Republican convention continued Thursday to play an active role.

Robert A. Elliott, chairman of the Oregon Republican Central Committee, was one of those recording the nomination of Gen. Dwight Eisenhower.

Ralph A. Cate, Oregon national committeeman, represented the Eisenhower forces in a meeting with spokesmen for other candidates where it was agreed to postpone the balloting until Friday.

Elliott in his seconding speech told the delegates:

"To make ours again a national party, we must make sure that it is a party of youth. As Ike has said, youth is our future. We need their votes; more than that we need their enthusiasm, their courage and their vision."

Earlier in the day the Oregon delegation split 9-9 on a proposal to change convention rules. Most of Oregon's leading politicians at the convention opposed the rule change—which by reorganizing the national committee wrests much control from the Southern States.

The rules change was adopted by the convention 683 to 513.

Opposing it were: Gov. Douglas McKay, Salem; Sen. Wayne L. Morse, Eugene; State Sen. William E. Walsh, Coos Bay; Mrs. James W. Mott, Salem; Carl Hogg, Salem; State Sen. Howard C. Belton, Canby; Gordon Orput and Shirie y A. Field, Portland, and Mark Hatfield, Salem.

Those approving the measure: H. H. DeArmond, Bend; Al Pierce, Coos Bay; H. W. Dent, The Dalles; Frank Fowler, Astoria; J. O. Johnson, Tigard; John Morgan and Lamar Tooze, Portland, and Robert Elliott, Medford.

McKay said he opposed the measure because he didn't think it was "well thought through."

Bid Awards Get Study

PORTLAND (AP) — Less than half of the four million dollars worth of highway construction and maintenance contracts for which bids were opened were awarded at Thursday's State Highway Commission meeting.

More than two million dollars worth of contracts were referred by the commission to its engineer for study and possible award.

In this category was a contract for grading one stretch and paving another on the Columbia River Highway, Parker Schramm Construction Co., Portland, was low bidder on the project at \$1,223,961.

Also referred to the engineer was a contract for grading and surfacing two areas on the Divide-Rice Hill section of the Pacific Highway in Douglas County, and grading and paving part of the Benton County Line-Cheshire section of the Territorial Highway in Lane County.

Babler Bros., Portland, was low bidder on the Douglas County project, \$988,529. Porter W. Yett, Portland, was low on the Lane County job at \$173,531.

Projects for which contracts were awarded included:

Douglas County, construction of a bridge over Callapooza Creek on Elkton-Sutherlin Highway.

Klamath and Lane Counties, rock production on Willamette Highway.

Lane County, grading and paving part of the Sisulaw Highway.
