## Champion Westland Stays In

TACOMA (AP) — It's defending champion Jack Westland of Everett versus young Bruce Cudd of Portland and 1950 U.S. Open champion Al Merritt of Spokane against Bill Mawhinney, Canada's former amateur champ, in the semi-finals Friday of the Pacific Northwest Golf Association championships.

In women's play, defending title holder Edean Anderson of Helena, Mont., meets Patty Lesser of Seattle and Mrs. Mike Banks, another Seattleite, faces Mrs. Henry Hutscher of Tacoma.

The 36-hole semi-finals are being played at the Tacoma Golf and Country Club.

**ST. PAUL** — Smooth-stroking Westland continued his superb golf Thursday, outting Dr. Herman Dahl of Tacoma 3 and 2. The methodical Westland was two-under for the round.

Mawhinney's victim in one of the day's best exhibitions was Carl Jonson of Seattle. The ex-champ from Vancouver fired birdies from the sixth through the ninth holes eliminating Jonson 4 and 3.

Moment ousted Dick Yost of Portland, one of the pre-tourney favorites, 2 and 1, and Clarence Smith of Seattle went down before Cudd by the same score.

## WSC's Halin Reaches NPL Semifinal Round

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Four guys from Illinois, California, Florida and Washington teed off Friday in the semi-finals of the unpredictable National Public Links tournament. Scheduled to go off first in the 36-hole, next-to-last test of this week-long amateur marathon were Omar L. Bogan, furniture salesman from South Gate, Calif., and Bob Jurs, 32-year-old Eastern Air Lines pilot of Miami Springs, Fla.

Right behind were Bob Scherer, young Illinois laborer, matching strokes with John Halin, long, lanky student from Washington State.

The winners will tangle in another 36-hole argument Saturday to decide the championship of the American municipal courses.

Scherer, the 21-year-old Decatur, Ill., workman whose pleasant manner and coolness under fire has made him a favorite, came through the quarterfinals with a 1-up victory over Tommy Bean, ex-pro from Trion, Ga., who just recently got back his amateur standing.

Halin won the hot berth opposite Scherer with a 2 and 1 quarterfinal decision over Arnold Koehler, 22-year-old grocery salesman from Indianapolis.

Bogan defeated Dub Pagan, the West Palm Beach, Fla., fireman, 2 and 1, in what he called a "grudge match."

Kurz got his berth opposite Bogan by scoring a 2 and 1 victory over 18-year-old Donald Thornton of Los Angeles.

# U.S. Games Athletes Shake Plaguing Pains

HELSINKI (AP) — The aches and pains which have been plaguing American track forces began disappearing Friday and indications were that Mike Sam's runners, jumpers and throwers will be at full strength for the opening of the Olympic Games next week.

Mal Whitfield, hope for double gold medal triumph in middle distances, held a good workout Thursday and said he was not bothered by a pulled muscle in his leg. He said he would be primed for a shot at both the 400 and 800 meter tests.

Andy Stanfield, Seton Hall straggler, also troubled by a leg muscle said he felt so good he wishes he had tried for 100 meters as well as the 200.

Meanwhile, America's full Olympic squad of nearly 400 athletes, was scheduled to be on the scene by Friday night with arrival of swimmers, divers and water polo team.

Next-to-last contingent checked in Thursday night from New York. There were 82 aboard including 26 rowers, 24 fencers, 12 bicycle racers and 10 canoeers.

## Savitt, Jap Red Hot In Clay Court Scrap

CHICAGO (AP) — Californians composed half the eight-player field in Friday's quarterfinals of the National Clay Courts tennis tourney, but a top-seeded Easterner and a Japanese Davis Cupper were the hottest contenders.

Bill the man to beat was Dick Savitt, Orange, N. J., the nation's No. 2 player, first-ranked in this meet, who moved against fifth-seeded Grant Golden of Wilmette, Ill.

But Savitt's play at River Forest Tennis Club this week—only four games dropped in 40 played during three rounds—has been duplicated exactly by Japan's No. 1 Davis Cupper, Jiro Kumamaru.

Savitt and Kumamaru have played almost flawless tennis in their sweep through the first three rounds. Of the Jap's four games lost out of 40, three were recorded Thursday in beating Don Kaiser of Louisville, Ky., 6-1, 6-2.
