OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis.—Barbara Custer, a 1952 Klamath Union High School graduate, has been awarded a tuition scholarship to attend Oregon State College during the 1952-53 school year, according to Dallas W. Norton, chairman of the OSC Scholarship Committee.

Ninety-two high school seniors were selected as winners. Awarded on a competitive basis, these scholarships are valued at \$90, and will cover tuition and partial fees. Basis for selection includes academic achievements and reasonable financial need.

All total 173 scholarships were granted. These included 32 foreign students, 19 Alaskan and Hawaiian students, and 20 persons with previous work at OSC.

Miss Custer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Brooks O. Custer, 3428 Shasta Way, Klamath Falls, was salutatorian of her graduating class. She was active in high school as secretary of Spanish Club and president of Girls' League Dance-a-Lot. She was also a member of Honor Society. New Record For United States

ABOARD S.S. UNITED STATES (N) — The Liner United States, new queen of the seas, recorded Saturday the highest day's run of any ship afloat.

Speaking westward toward New York, the black and white beauty at noon Eastern Atlantic time had covered 903 nautical miles in the 24 hours, since noon Friday at 36.06 knots.

"This clip compared with an average speed of 35.59 knots in the eastbound crossing last week end, on which she set a record of three days, 10 hours, 40 minutes.

The United States, bearing 1,650 passengers, picked up speed for a possible attempt to smash the westward Atlantic crossing record immediately after clearing the English Channel Friday.

HONG KONG (N) — Robert T. Bryan, an American attorney, said Saturday the Chinese Communists beat him with a rubber hose and used spinal drug injections and writing statements from him during 18 months imprisonment.

Bryan, 59, a China resident for 45 years, was deported from China June 26. He refused to talk to newsmen of his experiences until he boarded the liner President Cleveland bound for San Francisco.

He said the Reds tortured him to confess but "most of the time I never could figure out what they wanted me to confess."

It was on April 16, he related, the Reds gave him a spinal injection. Under the influence of the drug, he said, he remembered dictating a "confession" to his captors. Again on June 7 he was forced to sign a criticism of the U. S.

Message Left At Crash Site

FAIRBANKS, Alaska (N) — Two notes, one bearing the words, "I am sorry, Colonel" were found near the body of a Sacramento, Calif. Air Force captain who apparently lived for seven days beside the wreckage of his crashed plane in the Yukon Valley.

Capt. Harvey Tilton, 35, was one of five men aboard the C-47 transport plane when it crashed Jan. 12. The bodies of the four other airmen were found huddled in a crude parachute shelter about a mile from the plane.

Tenth Air Rescue Squadron ground crewmen theorized that Tilton was unable to join the others after he reached the ground. The contents of one of the notes, a farewell message to his wife, were not revealed. The other was apparently an apology to Tilton's commanding officer, Col. Edward Moore, of Eielson Air Force Base, for losing the plane and its crew.

Seven marks had been scribbled on the note to Col. Moore, indicating that Tilton possibly had lived for seven days after the plane plunged to earth.

The wreckage of the plane was found Tuesday some 150 miles north of here.
