Councilmen Study Park Road Repair

Something should be done this summer to fix up Moore Park roads, members of the City Council said today. The council is studying whether it can be done legally in another matter.

In the current budget, no money is specifically earmarked for road improvement or repair in city parks. The Park Board some weeks ago asked that money for the repairs be budgeted, but it wasn't, and last night Alfred Collier, member of the Park Board, came before the City Council to ask for some help.

He pointed out that largely through his efforts the city is going to get about \$22,000 more money to spend on streets and roads this year than last—the money coming from the county treasury—and he feels the city should do some work on the about four miles of roads in the park.

COUNTY SHARE

Last year the city got \$28,700 from the county as its share of road money, and this year about \$51,000 will be forthcoming from that source. Collier also is a member of the county Budget Committee which budgeted the extra funds. The money comes, he said, primarily from increased revenues received from sale of O & C timber.
