Soccer On Tap For Russ

HELSINKI (AP) — Soviet Russia enters Olympic competition Tuesday night for the first time in its history on the soccer field at Kotka. A bare 33 miles from the Russian border, the big, husky all-star team of the Red Army from Moscow will meet their friendly neighbors from Bulgaria.

The match is one of nine preliminaries to the genuine Olympic soccer competition, which begins Saturday.

The Russian show will steal the Olympic spotlight away from Helsinki even though full-scale Olympic competition opens in field hockey in this clean, modern city Tuesday evening. Switzerland plays Austria and Finland meets Belgium.

Field hockey, which will complete all of its matches up to the semi-finals before the official opening of the games on Saturday, is the only Olympic sport in which the United States is not represented.

In the other soccer games Tuesday night — all played in the natural brilliant lightings of the long Finnish summer evenings — Yugoslavia will meet India in Helsinki. Hungary will play Romania at Toru, Poland will tackle France at Lahli and Denmark will face Greece at Tampere.

The preliminary basketball competition, designed to chop an original entry of 21 down to 16 by the time the games open, runs into its second day of double elimination.

The United States, Soviet Russia and eight other teams were given free passes through these warm-ups. Monday's winners were Cuba, Egypt, Hungary, Canada, Bulgaria and the Philippines. They beat, in order, Belgium, Turkey, Greece, Italy, Switzerland and Israel.

The first drawings for track events Monday put Americans into a shoulder-to-shoulder competition with the Russians in the 400-meter hurdle heats and in one 800-meter heat. There will be no American-Russian meetings in the first round of the 100-meter dash.

The games, which open officially on Saturday, will run through Aug. 2.

Archery Season Protested

LAKEVIEW (Special) — Protesting against a proposed buck deer archery season within the confines of the Hart Mountain National Antelope Refuge in Lake County, a resolution was forwarded to the Oregon Game Commission by the board of control of the Order of the Antelope, Lakeview.

The protest was aimed at the commission session in Portland July 11 and 12. Francis Lambert, Portland, a past Chief White Tail of the Order, was in person to protest the special hunt, said being considered.

The game commissioners are apparently studying the protest; no decision had been reached Monday.

CONVENTION
The order, which is an association for the preservation and conservation of wildlife and resources, is scheduled to hold its 17th annual convention at the Blue Sky Hotel on the antelope refuge July 18, 19 and 20. The board of control, made up of Lake County men who are members of the order, handles official business of the group and Jess Faha, a past Chief White Tail of the order, is chairman of the board of control. The order is sponsored by the Lake County Chamber of Commerce, 158-1/2 Main St., Lakeview.

The order was formed in 1932 when a small group met on the mountain to consider ways of conserving the fast-dwindling herds of antelope. Activities of the order resulted, in 1936, in establishment of the antelope refuge under the US Fish & Wildlife Service.

RESOLUTION
The resolution contends that hunting, by any means, should not be permitted on the refuge "at this time" because there is no lack of feed there for the deer and antelope herds, because the herds there actually restock other areas which are annually open to hunting, because the deer and antelope herds there are of greatest value from a scenic standpoint, and because "in our opinion it would not be in the public interest to open the refuge at this time for the alleged purpose of keeping the big game herds in balance with their feed supply."
