### TYEES WIDEN LEAD

The Victoria Tyees continued their march toward a Western International League pennant Tuesday night as they pushed seven runs across in the second inning to trip the Lewiston Broncos, 10-5.  
The Tyees poured their barrage of seven runs across the plate without a hit, marking up the tallies on five walks, three errors, a hit batter and a wild pitch.  
In other league action Tuesday night, the third-place Vancouver Capilanos gained a full game on the falling second-place Spokane Indians as the Caps downed the tribe 11-7. Yakima continued along the win trail by defeating Tri-City 14-11 and Salem pushed Wenatchee deeper into the cellar, 6-4.  
The Capilanos sailed away their win in the first two innings, with four runs in the opening frame and four in the second and then coasted the rest of the way.  
The Yakima-Tri-City misup turned into an old-fashioned slugfest, with a total of 36 hits rapped on. The hit parade had a partner in the pitcher parade as six hurlers were called up for mound chores.  
Tri-City, trailing 3-1, staged a six-run rally in the seventh, but it fell short.  
A fifth-inning solo homer by manager Hugh Libby broke a three-all tie between Spokane and Wenatchee and the Senators maintained the lead for their win over the Chiefs. Bud Hejmsa accounted for one of Wenatchee's runs with a solo circuit clout in the sixth.

Matthews made no extra motions in three rounds with Simmons.  
It was Matthews' first New York workout for the Marciano fight and some observers were impressed with the speed of his hands and his quick counters.

### Basilio, Davey In Rematch

CHICAGO (AP)—Undefeated Chuck Davey, the college kid who made good as a pro, takes a second swipe Wednesday night at a used "sleeper" who nearly wrecked his welterweight title campaign May 29.  
Davey, stylish southpaw with a savage solar plexus punch, boxes a nationally televised 10-rounder against Carmen Basilio of Canada, N.Y., at the Chicago stadium.  
Davey was established a 7 to 5 favorite.  
It was the lightly-reckoned Basilio who 48 days ago walked out of a Syracuse ring with a 10-round verdict over Davey only to have the New York Athletic Commission rule the bout a draw later.  
The decision was reversed because the referee, who voted for Basilio, turned in an incomplete scoring card. That preserved Davey's bid for a shot at Kid Gavilan's welter crown.
