

### Church Plans Annual Camp

Klamath Falls Seventh-day Adventists are joining those from 101 other cities and towns in Western Oregon in their annual gathering at the conference camp ground, Gladstone Park, 10 miles south of Portland.

Dr. A. E. Burns, S. D. Crowl, Cooper L. Brown, and Mrs. A. E. Burns, missionary secretary, will represent the lay preachers' institute which will be held during the first three days of the 10-day encampment, from July 17 to 27. Up to 15,000 attend during the two weekends. Half of these will be housed on the grounds while the rest will commute from Portland and other nearby cities.

P. C. Alderson, pastor of the Klamath Falls church, will be on the grounds soon to help 4 brother ministers set up the camp. By Thursday a mushroom town of 1750 lodges, cabins and tents, with its own water system, cafeteria, grocery store, police and fire staffs, will be set up on the 70-tract which the Oregon Conference purchased in 1932 for these annual gatherings.

George E. Vandeman of the General Ministerial Association will instruct the lay preachers. Besides three days' training, there will be reports from prominent laymen who have engaged in public evangelistic services, radio work and other missionary activities during the past year. Platform interviews with some of the persons won by lay efforts will be featured.

W. H. Branson, General Conference president, and the Voice of Prophecy radio group will be featured during the last week-end. Other Klamath Falls residents who will attend the great convocation are: Mrs. John Cook, F. L. Chittwood and about 75 other members of the local church.

### Juveniles Ruin Woods Resort

Regular dances at the Lake of the Woods resort Saturday nights and Sundays have been discontinued, announces Mrs. Tom Neeley, co-manager of the resort, because of the misconduct and destructive tendencies of a few teenagers.

Mrs. Neeley wrote the Herald and News that destruction, vandalism and drinking by young people visiting the lake and resort reached a new high over the Fourth of July holidays.

Much personal property was damaged or destroyed, she said, windows in a youth camp recreation building were broken out, and a privately owned boat was chopped open.

The teenagers apparently get beer and other liquor in Klamath Falls and bring it to the lake for overnight parties.

The situation has become such, Mrs. Neeley wrote, that weekend and holiday dancing at the popular resort has been discontinued in an attempt to keep the disturbing element out.

### Fish Thieves Wreck Study

Trout bandits are messing up a Game Commission investigation of delayed trout mortality in Lake and Harney County waters, reports Bill Lightfoot, Southeastern Oregon game supervisor.

Fish rustlers have taken 87 legalized trout from a wire mesh live-box set in Deep Creek in Lake County, and 77 from another live-box in Silves River in Harney County.

The object of the study was to determine survival of hatchery-born trout following long hauls from hatcheries in fish tank trucks.

During a trout stocking, 100 of the fish are placed in a live-box and checked daily until the losses by death stop.

But the persons swiping the fish are playing hob with the study, as well as damaging state property.

### Arizona Takes Ritterbusch

Peace officers from Phoenix, Ariz., are in Klamath Falls today today Rudy Ritterbusch, who faces auto theft charges at Phoenix.

Ritterbusch, whose true name probably is Carl A. Thompson, has been held in the County Jail for about 10 days. He was picked up here on a traffic charge, and revealed to State Police he was wanted in several states for various criminal activities.

He waived extradition to Arizona and also to Woburn, Mass., where he is wanted for grand larceny, but is to be returned to Arizona.

### Portland Bank Gives Dividend

PORTLAND (AP) — Directors of the First National Bank of Portland Wednesday declared a dividend of \$960,000.

President Frank Belgrano Jr. said the dividend amounts to 80 cents a share on the 1,200,000 outstanding shares of stock. It will be payable in two periods—40 cents a share Oct. 1, 1952, to stockholders of record Sept. 18, 1952, and 40 cents a share payable Jan. 1, 1953, to stockholders of record Dec. 20, 1952.
