Stricken Man Files Suit

PORTLAND (P) - Connie G. Farrell, Portland, one of 138 persons treated at a hospital for food poisoning after a Bolshoi's picnic, filed a \$7,600 damage suit Friday.

The operators of Bill's Delicatessen and Catering Service, William C. Hunter and William O. Miltenberger, were named defendants.

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He had been in the County Jail about 10 days, accused of passing a small bad check at a local service station.

Scuffle Ends In Gunplay

THE MEXICAN NATIONAL PROGRAM

There will DEFINITELY be a shortage of labor in Tulelake for this fall's harvest due mainly to insufficient housing in the area.

Tulelake Growers Association can bring in and house up to 325 Mexican Nationals for the fall harvest, in the central labor camp at Newell.
