## Rival Union Men Clash

**TERRE HAUTE, Ind.** — Rival unionists clashed Monday outside the Allis-Chalmers plant and at least five men were stabbed and beaten. About 60 police officers led by Chief Frank Riddle charged in swinging night sticks, broke up the disorder and arrested two men on charges of assault and battery. The disorder started when about 100 members of the AFL International Union of Operating Engineers gathered a picket line set up by the CIO United Auto Workers. Riddle said some of the injured apparently were stabbed with broken bottles and others were clubbed. Five of the injured were taken to a hospital and the condition of one of them, John Martin of Paris, Ill., was described as critical. After the brief skirmish, the two factions withdrew to opposite sides of the street and shouted invective across the open area patrolled by police.

## Forest Group Favors Tax

**PORTLAND** — A November ballot measure calling for elimination of the ton-mile tax on logging trucks will be opposed by the Associated Forest Industries of Oregon. The association, which says its members handle 80 per cent of the state's lumber and forestry business, and the tax elimination measure, if approved, would work a hardship on small trucking companies. The measure, an initiative is sponsored by the major trucking firms operating in the state and has the backing of the Teamsters Union. At a board meeting here Monday the association approved a resolution which said the state legislature intended for Oregon's highway construction and maintenance program to be financed by income from license plate fees, gasoline taxes and the ton-mile tax on trucks. Elimination of the ton-mile tax might result in higher license fees which would penalize short haul truckers, the resolution said.

## Six Killed In Bomber Crash

**ARTHUR, Neb.** — A B-25 Air Force bomber, its starboard engine ablaze, crashed and exploded late Sunday in this sparsely settled sandhills area of Western Nebraska. Of seven persons aboard, only one, the pilot, survived. He parachuted to safety. The plane, based at Andrews Air Force base near Washington, D. C., had refueled at the Lincoln, Neb., Naval Air Station and was en route to Mountain Home (Ida.) Air Force Base. The survivor is Col. John G. Eriksen of Arlington, Va. Identity of the others aboard was withheld pending notification of next of kin.

## Morse Mourns McMahon Loss

**WASHINGTON** — Sen. Wayne B. Morse (R-Ore.) said Monday that in the death of Sen. Brien McMahon of Connecticut "our country has lost one of the greatest statesmen of our generation." He added: "His leadership in retaining civilian control of atomic energy creates a debt which the American people will owe to him and his memory for generations to come." Senator McMahon died Monday of cancer.

## Reds Stalling Says UN Heads

**MUNSAN, Korea** — The United Nations command Tuesday accused the Reds of stalling in the staff officer talks on a proposed Korean armistice agreement. The charge came from the U. N. command spokesman, Lt. Col. Joseph J. Borchert, after U. N. and Communist staff officers met one hour and 44 minutes at Panmunjon on wording of the truce agreement draft. The staff officers are talking over the meaning of words and phrases in the draft while the full dress conference — deadlocked over the prisoner exchange issue — is in recess until Sunday. Col. Duncan S. Somerville, U. N. staff officer, told newsmen the Reds apparently are under the impression they "can make progress by putting fancy rosebuds on the chariot when we have no wheels on it." Somerville said he told the top Red staff officer, Col. Chang Chun San: "We are here today to try to resolve important matters which require good faith by both sides. We are not here to establish simultaneously a technicality in an obscure paragraph for bargaining purposes or to delay and confuse the valid issues." The Communist radio at Peiping, in a broadcast heard in Tokyo, accused the senior U. N. delegate, Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison, Jr., of quibbling in the recent secret negotiations and trying "All sorts of dodges" to re-classify Red prisoners as deserters.

## Plane Crash Injures Two

**KAMLOOPS, B. C.** — Pilot Jack Ferguson of Longview, Wash., and a 14-year-old passenger are in Kamloops Hospital after his light plane overshoot a landing strip and crashed near Clinton, B.C., Friday. Ferguson suffered a fractured hip. Carol Rankin sustained a possible fractured wrist. Howard Wrangell and the pilot's two sons, Grant and Neil, escaped injury. A B. C. forestry plane flew Ferguson and Miss Rankin to Kamloops Saturday.

## Eastern Oregon Without Water

**ONTARIO, Ore.** — Some 40,000 acres in Eastern Oregon were without water after a Sunday break in an irrigation canal wall. The area, 30 miles south of here, probably will be without water until Thursday when repairs are to be completed. Water is being hauled to the state phagoc farm which is in the arid region.

## AEC To Erect Testing Site

**WASHINGTON** — The Atomic Energy Commission Tuesday authorized a \$3 million dollar testing station for the development of atomic powered aircraft. Construction will begin this summer at the commission's national reactor testing station in Idaho. The commission announcement said 1,000 workers will be employed during the peak of construction and 200 operating employees will be required. Preliminary design studies for the ground test station have been made by Parsons-Macco-Kiewit Co. of Los Angeles under a subcontract with General Electric. The design, development and fabrication of the original engine are being handled by the aircraft gas turbine department, General Electric at Lockland, O. The nuclear phases of the project are associated with non-nuclear propulsion devices being developed by General Electric under an Air Force contract.
