

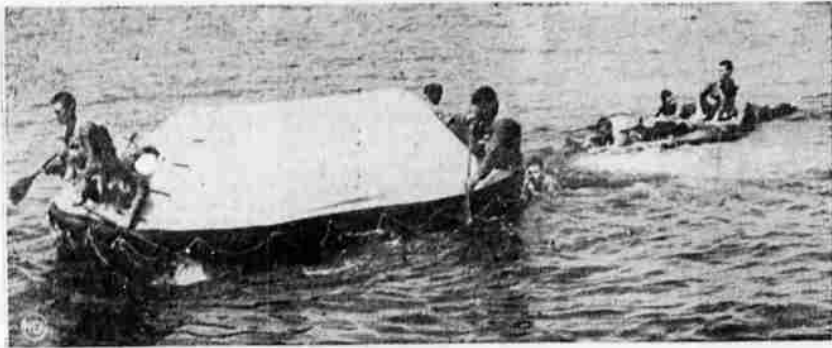
'SURVIVOR' swims to deflated lifeboat, pulls gas release cable.

Navy Demonstrates New 'Self-Rising' Lifeboat

THE NAVY RECENTLY made a dramatic test of a new rubber lifeboat at the New York Naval Air Station at Floyd Bennett Field, where these pictures were taken. In a simulated sea disaster, a Coast Guard helicopter dropped one of the new lifeboats to "survivors" struggling in the water. Half a minute after hitting the water, the "package" opened, the boat ballooned into shape and raised its protective canopy. In a short time—before any of them had time to suffer from exposure—the sailors climbed aboard and paddled to shore. Outstanding feature of the new boat, developed by the Navy in cooperation with the B. F. Goodrich Company, is its ability to inflate in 30 seconds and provide shelter, with a 70-degree temperature, for 5 survivors in either sub-zero or blistering tropical weather. Deflated package is thrown overboard. When a gas release cable is pulled, carbon dioxide gas under pressure quickly snaps the 230-pound, 15½-foot-long craft into shape.

Korea Relieves Red Pressure

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (AP)—United Nations fighting in Korea has taken Communist pressure "off all of Asia," Vice-Adm. C. Turner Joy said Monday. Joy saluted into Annapolis as superintendent of the Naval Academy, asserted the Communists "don't have the capacity to stage any other offensive." Pressure has been relieved in Indo-China, "possibly Hongkong and possibly Formosa," he said. Just back from three years as Naval Chief of the Far East and almost a year as chief United Nations delegate in dragging peace negotiations at Panmunjom, Joy moved in as 37th superintendent of the academy. He replaced Vice-Adm. Harry W. Hill, who retires this month. Joy told newsmen that he considered the Korean conflict "one of the most important wars we have fought in our history." "We have accomplished a great deal by containing Communism on the continent, even though we have not been able to agree on armistice terms," he said. By responding to Communist aggression in Korea, "we have told them they can go so far and no further," he said. "It has awakened us to the dangers of Communism."

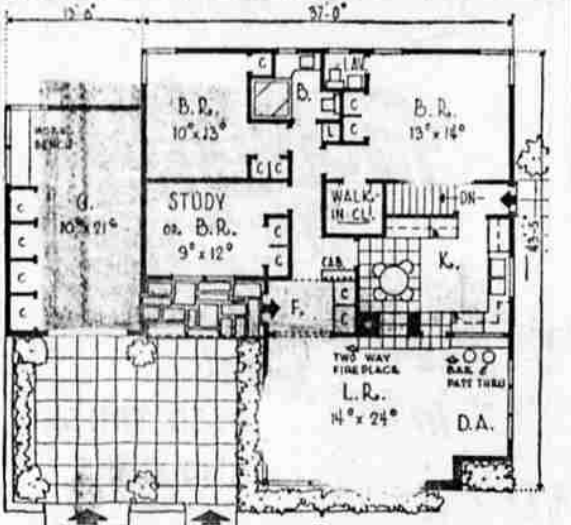
