Price Rises Noted For Retail Foods

Retail prices of several foods moved irregularly higher this week.
A few fresh vegetables advanced a little as drought conditions trimmed supplies from some growing areas.
Lean pork cuts rose to as much as a cent a pound, reflecting higher government ceilings and a tighter supply caused by partial livestock market quarantines to stop the spread of a hog disease.
And top grade eggs advanced 2 to 4 cents a dozen—a seasonal trend usual at this time of year.

When farmers are replacing their laying flocks with younger birds.
The trend in fresh produce prices varied considerably from place to place. The changes were sharpest in the south and in New England where the drought has hit hardest.
Beans, spinach, tomatoes and potatoes appeared to be the items most affected price-wise in the majority of stores.
But the long, hot dry spells also were causing quality deterioration of some items like onions, and hurrying the maturity of others like peaches.
Produce men said that although the week-to-week price advances of several vegetables didn't appear large, the increase over the last several weeks had brought prices

above the year-ago levels.
Peppers, lima beans, cabbage, broccoli, carrots, corn, cucumbers, onions and potatoes were in this category, they said.
Only last week, meat dealers were saying they would hold off as long as possible in boosting their prices of lean pork cuts to the higher ceiling levels recently authorized by price stabilizers.
They felt that pork prices already

were meeting consumer resistance.
However, pork supply channels were at least temporarily disrupted when stockyards in five cities were partially embargoed in moves to control a virus disease (vesicular exanthema) which af-

fects only hogs—not other animals or humans.

Hell's Canyon Dam Foreseen

BOISE — Reclamation Commissioner Michael Straus predicted here Wednesday the controversial Hell's Canyon Dam will be constructed on the Snake River in the not too distant future.
Straus said the bureau will offer the next Congress a bill similar to the one lost in the last session calling for early construction of the dam.
The commissioner said the previous bill, shelved after hearings by a House Interior affairs subcommittee, protected fishery water rights, contrary to arguments advanced by opponents of the measure.

Finnish Worker, Once A Red Polio Group Ordered Deported From U. S. Wants Nurses

BOSTON — A Finnish-born 49-year-old mill worker of Wendell, N.H., who says he signed a Communist party membership application in 1934 because "they told me they wanted to win a strike in which I was involved" was ordered deported Wednesday.
Federal Judge Charles E. Wyvausk Jr. ruled "with reluctance" that Carl A. Latva, who signed the Communist application, paid 50 cents and "never heard from them again," must be deported to his native Finland.
Judge Wyzanski said that under the McCarran act he was bound to

enforce the deportation of Latva. The McCarran act, passed by Congress in 1950 over President Truman's veto, was aimed at subversives.
Among other things it authorizes deportation of aliens who have been members of any organization advocating violent overthrow of the U.S. government.
Aliens ordered deported, but who aren't accepted by their homeland, may be jailed here for six months.
Latva, whose two sons served in the U.S. Navy in World War II, said at his home:
"An immigrant like me... I don't know right from wrong because I hadn't been here very long. Then 20 years later because I tell the truth they want to break up my family and take me away from the country I love."

NEW YORK — Three health and disaster agencies appealed Wednesday for more trained nurses and physical therapists to help fight polio outbreaks in various sections of the nation.
The appeal was issued by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, the American Red Cross and the American Physical Therapy Association.
Dr. Kenneth S. Landauer, the foundation's director of medical services, said the polio peril is greatest in Illinois, Louisiana, Texas, Oklahoma, Iowa, Nebraska, New Mexico, Michigan, Ohio and Washington.

SEATTLE — A slight earthquake of less than three minutes duration felt by residents here was recorded at 10:22 (PDT) Wednesday morning by the University of Washington seismograph station.
The station located the tremor's epicenter at about five to ten miles south of the University which would place it approximately in the industrial area south of the city.

The quake's intensity was recorded as III on the Mercalli intensity scale, the station said. This scale ranges from I—not felt, to XII—total destruction.
