NEW YORK (AP)—Dr. Bella V. Dodd, who drifted away from the Roman Catholic church to become a top woman Communist party leader, has been received back into the Catholic faith.

She and Roman Catholic sources disclosed Tuesday that she was baptized on April 8 in St. Patrick's Cathedral after taking weekly instructions from the most Rev. Fulton J. Sheen, auxiliary bishop of New York.

Dr. Dodd, an attorney and former political science teacher at Hunter College, said she is "happier now than . . . ever before."

## Talmadge Vetoes Wilson Wyatt

ATLANTA (AP)—Gov. Herman Talmadge Wednesday termed the appointment of Wilson Wyatt "the only mistake Gov. Adlai Stevenson has made since Chicago."

Stevenson, Democratic presidential nominee, has named Wyatt, former mayor of Louisville, Ky., his campaign director.

Talmadge told his news conference he didn't know too much about Wyatt but that he was "past president of the Americans for Democratic Action whose only mission in life apparently is that of Southern throat-cutting."

## Senator's Tax Accusations Said Responsible For Threat

WASHINGTON (AP)—A well-placed source said Wednesday Sen. Williams (R-De) has been threatened with harm as a result of his charges of tax evasion by racketeers.

"Don't be asking me about it," Williams told a reporter when asked about the threats. "Nobody will ever get confirmation of such a statement from me."

The informant, who declined to be named, said in an interview he knows the threats were made, but that Williams has refused to treat them seriously.

Carl Sparks, former merchants vice-president, has moved to Yakima to enter business for himself.

The report of Doug Spencer, chairman of the "Tuesday Red Hot Values" committee, that the fall schedule of this program starts Tuesday, Sept. 9 was also okayed.

This is a voluntary group offering of special values for Tuesdays only which was conducted last spring.

Dick Maguire, chairman of the merchants street traffic committee reported that some progress had been made toward getting an agreement between all interested groups on improving the city facilities for handling motor traffic.

Completion of the S. 6th Street viaduct lane traffic flow, is commonly accepted as the No. 1 crying need.

In addition there is a need for improving the cross-town flow of traffic and getting the City of Klamath Falls out from under the burden of maintaining through truck streets within the city.

Maintaining the streets from the pounding it gets from trucks takes a major part of the city's street money. This can be accomplished

only if trucks follow a designated state highway on which the state accepts maintenance costs, Maguire said.

The merchants are completely opposed to routing trucks through the retail district, and suggest a street somewhere between the retail and industrial districts for a north-south state highway route.
