

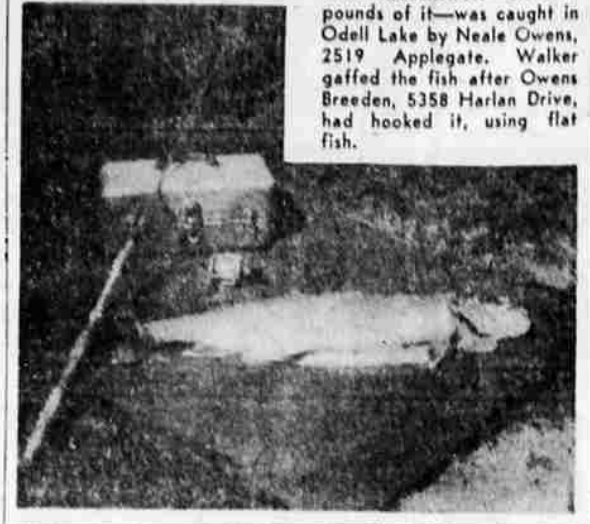

They resent Leichter's interference in her career and his influence over Rita. Leichter and his wife are Rita's closest friends these days.

Groucho Marx, pleased with critical reaction to his straight emulating in "Ring Around Elizabeth" on the La Jolla stage, will follow with a movie role without his mustache and leer.

The telephone number handed to Robert Taylor at a night spot belonged to a glamor star who's in no position to ask for midnight calls (hobby was on a fishing trip). Taylor, without knowing whose number it was, tore up the note, then burned it.

Dolores Del Rio, who hasn't made an English-language movie since 1947, has decided on "Discord" by John Bright as the film that will bring her back to American audiences. It will be made in Mexico.

Alan Ladd stars in "White South", a yarn about Arctic whaling, when he winds up in "Red Beret" in London. Deanna Durbin's ex-husband, Felix Jackson, is back in town. He's given up his New York TV production duties. Bob Mitchum and Ida Lupino have shaken hands on it. He'll star in "Hound Dog Man" and Ida will direct. There's a big deal cooking for Rosalind Russell to star on Broadway in a musical version of "My Sister Eileen." Roz starred in the picture 10 years ago.

If you hate popcorn munchers at the movies, rush back to your TV set. The National Association of Popcorn Manufacturers has prepared for bigger movie attendance ahead—with an increase of 10 per cent in the popcorn acreage this year over last year.

Betty Hutton's bust-up with Paramount gives Ginger Rogers the role of Rosetta Duncan in "Topsy and Eva" for the summer. She's signed as technical director for "Houdini" at Paramount. Tony Curtis plays the title role.

Jack Erlich, the eight-foot giant who appeared in "Jack and the Beanstalk," died suddenly in El Paso. MGM will film "George," an original story by actor John Shelton and movie press agent Paul Ross. The story is about a New York songwriter who discovers a singing dog and collaborates with the animal to fame and fortune.

The Joan Bennett-Walter Wanger home is for sale. The price tag: \$375,000.

Jeanmire, the French ballet star of "Hans Christian Andersen," is denying she'll wed her ballet partner, Roland Petit. Maïa Powers is showing an improvement from her serious illness, but her doctors still won't give her the green light to resume her movie career.

## Klamath Y Slates Camp

A four-day camp for boys 10 through 14 is to be held next week by the Klamath YMCA at Diamond Lake. Boys are to be ready to leave the downtown YMCA headquarters Monday, 9 a.m., and will return Thursday night.

YMCA Director Paul Campbell is organizing the outing with the aid of John Sandmeyer, the Y's Camp Committee chairman, and Sam Ritchie.

Boys will be charged \$6 for the entire trip. Each boy must provide either a sleeping bag or adequate blankets. He should also have, if possible, a swimming suit, flashlight, warm clothing for evenings and shoes suitable for hiking.

The camp is to be in the Medford Y.M.C.A.'s Diamond Lake camp quarters.

Two well-known Portland campers and Y workers will serve as Campbell's aides at the camp. Elmer Dewitt, who directs waterfront activities and swimming for Portland area 4-H and Y camps will come here for the trip. Accompanying him will be Eugene Mead, head trails counselor for YMCA camps in the Portland area.

Also assisting will be Eagle Scout Charles Portland and Campbell's son, Doug, who has had eight years experience at the Portland Y camp.

## Irrigation Project Due

WASHINGTON (AP) — Plans to irrigate 8,700 acres of land adjacent to Chief Joseph Dam will be completed this year, the Bureau of Reclamation advised the office of Sen. Cordon (R-Ore.) Thursday.

An aide told a reporter he had been advised the land, which lies in the Foster Creek unit, also includes 2,700 acres for which supplemental irrigation water would be provided.

The plans will be submitted to the new Congress which would have to approve the project before appropriations could be made.

The bureau was authorized in the closing days of the recent session to study the feasibility of irrigation in connection with the Columbia River dam.

The Foster Creek unit, which has been under investigation for some time, would be the first specific project upon which Congress would be called to pass.

Also contemplated is the reclamation of 13,700 acres of land in the greater Wenatchee area. The Bureau expects to have a report on this project ready for submission by June, 1954.
