Pacific Powers Launch First Peacetime Pacts

HONOLULU (AP)—Foreign ministers of the U.S., Australia and New Zealand launched Thursday the first formal peacetime system of military cooperation among the three nations.
 However, they adopted a "go slow" policy on bringing other non-Communist Pacific nations into the security organization.
 That would be premature, said a communique issued after they adjourned their three-day conference Wednesday night.
 But they promised that other countries would be consulted closely through regular diplomatic channels.
 The foreign minister of one in-

terested nation not present, Joaquin Elizalde of the Philippines, said in Manila his country and Japan may join the ANZUS powers soon in a five-power conference to coordinate Pacific defense against Communism.
 He did not say who would take the initiative.
 U.S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson told reporters the ANZUS meetings had been "very intimate, very informal," and "we are all very happy."
 Richard G. Casey, Australian minister for external affairs, said the sessions were without argument or maneuvering for position. T. Clifton Webb, New Zealand's foreign minister, declared:
 "We are very appreciative to the United States and we have been taken completely into their confidence and thinking."
 Key step taken to implement last year's three-power treaty signed in San Francisco was the creation of a joint military staff to meet periodically at Pearl Harbor, Melbourne and Wellington, N.Z.
 The communique said the first meeting would be held shortly at Honolulu "to work out details of the military machinery, the general nature of which was agreed to."
 Adm. Arthur W. Radford, U.S. Pacific Fleet commander, was designated American representative to the military staff.
 Australia and New Zealand will name theirs later.

Meat Casualty As Fires Hit

Five fire alarms were sounded in greater Klamath Falls yesterday and when all the smoke cleared away there remained for the damage list only one cremated pot roast.
 Two of the alarms were for small grass fires and two others were false alarms turned in by jittery people who said they smelled smoke.
 First of the five alarms came at 1:11 p.m. That was a grass fire at Bismark and Front Streets. While city firemen were dousing that one, an alarm came from the Anita Shop, 7th and Main Streets, at 1:23 p.m. That was one of the smoke-smelling alarms and no fire was found.
 At 2:50 p.m., suburban firemen raced to the home of the N. W. Mayfields at 2527 Ward Street. There was no one home and a very much over-roasted roast was belching smoke from the oven.
 City firemen rolled again at 6:38 p.m. to quell a small grass fire at Oregon Avenue and Upham Street. The final alarm came at 11:28 last night. It was another "smoke-smeller" from 6th and Main Streets and again no fire was found.
