Air Pioneer, Two Others Killed in Airplane Crash

SEATTLE (AP) — A plane crash in a rugged Cascade Mountain area late Thursday killed two women and a pilot who was identified almost positively as one of the nation's pioneer aviators. The victims are believed to be E. W. Cleveland, 62, of Cleveland, O., his wife, Lucille, and his secretary, Mrs. Annabelle Elmisle, 43.

The light plane crashed when it trapped itself on a flight from Spokane to Renton, outside Seattle. It crashed and burned near Mount Baldy, about 30 miles southeast of Seattle, in a wilderness area close to twice that distance by highway and back roads.

A sheriff's party riddled from the isolated scene late Thursday night that the pilot and one woman were burned almost beyond recognition.

Philippine Rains Fatal

MANILA (AP) — Twelve persons were listed as dead or missing in Central Luzon Friday as the result of three days of heavy monsoon rains and high tides.

Rains lashing the largest of the Philippine Islands slackened but the Weather Bureau said more downpours could be expected. The bureau said 18 inches of rain had fallen in the three days.

Communications were disrupted. The toll of dead and missing may go higher when they are restored.

Damage in Manila and at least 12 other flooded towns neared \$1,000,000. Losses of vitally needed rice crops was reported to be considerable.

His discussion will deal with education, organization and legislation as it concerns union labor. A waterman fee is to be put on by the Central Labor Council after the meeting.

Strike Threat Hits Controls

WASHINGTON (AP) — John L. Lewis' demand for new wage contracts for his soft coal miners appeared Friday to have thrown a monkey wrench into government plans to take price controls off the bituminous coal industry.

A price control official said the Office of Price Stabilization (OPS) was on the verge of suspending soft coal ceilings before Lewis served notice in the past two weeks that he wants to end his United Mine Workers' contracts with the industry Sept. 30.

Now, this official told a reporter, the price agency will have to adopt a wait-and-see attitude.

Of primary concern, he said, is whether a strike will occur and for how long.

Military Asks Doctor Draft

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army and the Air Force Friday asked for the drafting of 371 physicians and 200 dentists in October.

A Defense Department announcement said the call includes 196 doctors and 110 dentists for the Army and 175 doctors and 90 dentists for the Air Force.

Counting the October call, 1,893 doctors and 850 dentists have been inducted or ordered to active duty since last July.

Detroit Gets Late Mail

DETROIT (AP) — Thousands of east side Detroit residents Friday began receiving letters four and five years old as postal inspectors sifted through a basement-filled pile of undelivered and stolen mail.

The letters, estimated at more than 10,000, plus tons of packages containing every form of mailable merchandise, were recovered in the house of Roman Kortes, a 50-year old veteran mailman.

Kortes pleaded guilty in Federal Court here Thursday, less than six hours after his arrest to two charges of embezzlement from the mails.

Malik Cancels Vacation Plan

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — Russia's Jaakko A. Malik has for the second time postponed his scheduled vacation in the Soviet Union.

This led delegates to speculate again Friday whether something big was brewing—possibly in the Korean truce talks.

The Holland-American line confirmed that Russia's delegate to the U.N. had cancelled passage booked on the liner Nieuw Amsterdam for Aug. 12. Earlier he had cancelled a booking for July 22.

Other delegates have been watching the Korean developments closely, but so far have seen nothing to indicate any imminent breakthrough. While the 1952 General Assembly scheduled to open Oct. 14, Malik may now find the time is too short to go to Russia this summer. Because of a heart ailment, he does not like to fly.

UN officials said they knew of no forthcoming meetings that would require Malik's presence before the assembly meets.

Britain's Sir Gladwyn Jebb left earlier this week for a vacation in England.

At a recent social function, Lady Jebb was reported to have discussed vacation plans with Malik.

An informant said she jokingly told Malik:

"I hope you will do nothing to spoil our holiday."

"Go ahead and enjoy it," Malik was understood to have replied. "I can assure you that nothing will happen."

USDA Assists South-East

The billion dollar drought in New England and the south appeared broken Friday and government agencies moved swiftly to get weather-harassed farmers back into production.

The immediate goals:

1. To get the hungry livestock on burned out pastures and prevent premature slaughtering.

2. To get fall planting started.

The Agriculture Department ordered a survey of excess hay supplies in the midwest.

It directed chairmen of state agricultural mobilization committees from Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan, Indiana, and Illinois to look into the possibility of obtaining hay in those states.

And the farmers home administration worked out a plan to speed government loans to hard-pressed farmers in the drought-hit belts.

These loans will be used for seed and feed.

Officials had one kind word for the drought.

"They said the dry weather probably has saved the 1952 wheat crop from an outbreak of rust disease that could have destroyed millions of bushels."
