

Korea Talks Said To Be On Deathbed

MUNBAN, Korea, (AP) — The Korean truce talks may be on their deathbed.

They seem paralyzed. They show symptoms of dying a slow, distressing death — on the doorstep to success.

After one year of negotiating, war prisoner exchange is the only issue blocking the path to peace. But there seems no solution to this question which can satisfy both belligerents.

The U. N. and Communist delegates have met only twice in two weeks.

They have talked exactly one hour and twenty-four minutes in the past 17 days.

The negotiators called another week-long recess Monday.

For seven more days, the truce teams will hide their time at Munban and Kaesong as the war flames on.

Major Gen. William K. Harrison, U. N. Delegate Monday tersely told the Communists: "There seems nothing to discuss."

NO CHANGE

"There is no way," Harrison explained, "in which we can change our position." And, he added, the Allied stand "cannot be reconciled" with the Communist demands.

North Korean Gen. Nam Il, chief Red delegate, demands the Allies return 116,000 prisoners in U. N. stockades.

He says this number must include all 20,000 Chinese soldiers in captivity.

But Harrison says "no" and he adds "never."

The U. N. Command offers to return 83,000 men, including 6,400 Chinese.

The rest have renounced Communism, and the Allies staunchly refuse to force them back at bayonet-point.

In July, the delegates wrestled the controversy in secret for 18 sessions.

But the Reds refused to accept the \$3,000 offer.

SECRECY OFF

Secrecy was ended. On July 26, Harrison angrily walked out of the tent as Nam Il protested loudly.

The talks have been in one recess after another since then, except for minor staff sessions.

The reluctant Chinese undoubtedly are the enemy's main concern.

The Communists don't want to let 13,600 of Red China's former soldiers stay south.

Nam Il repeatedly has told Harrison that no armistice can possibly be achieved unless all 20,000 Chinese are hauled up to Panmunjom and sent across the line.

Nam played the same old record Monday. So the deadlock goes on, as tight as ever. What hopes remain for an armistice?

The only visible note of encouragement is the fact the delegations are still meeting — at least once a week.

Both sides naturally would be reluctant to get the blame for ending the talks.

No each side patiently waits out the other. Clearly, Washington or Moscow and Peking must yield.

And only a major policy shift will be a strong enough medicine to get the talks off the sickbed.

Tacoma News Strike Over

TACOMA (AP) — Settlement of Newspaper Guild strike against the Tacoma News Tribune was announced jointly Sunday by the Guild and the Tribune Publishing Co.

Terms were not announced.

The joint statement said: "Following negotiations between the Guild and the Tacoma News Tribune, a satisfactory agreement has been reached. It is understood the Guild will withdraw its picket line immediately and that the News Tribune will resume publication at the earliest possible date."

The Guild strike was called July 19 to support demands for a job security clause in the contract. It followed a 14-week strike of AFL President.
