Republicans, Democrats Maneuver On The Eve of Election Campaign

 Like two great armies on the eve of battle, the clash and rattle of maneuvering for position began to arise in earnest today from the Democratic and Republican camps.

D-Day — Labor Day Sept. 1 — was precisely three weeks away and there was much preparation for the two months of campaigning that will follow. The presidential election is Nov. 4.

At Denver, Gen. Dwight Eisenhower arranged for serious powwows after a relaxing visit yesterday with 35 American Indian tribes. The outcome of his conference with leaders of eight Southern states may decide what kind of Republican thrust will be made into the Democrats' Dixie stronghold.

At Springfield, Ill., Democrats used words like "general" and "commander-in-chief" in a somewhat discordant, albeit good humored, discussion of just how firmly Illinois' Gov. Adlai Stevenson

will grasp the Democratic standard.

GOP presidential nominee Eisenhower, after the Southern-state conference, scheduled a meeting with some Republican members of congressional agriculture committees and other party farm leaders.

Eisenhower flew from Denver to Gallup, N. M., yesterday to address an estimated 10,000 attending the 31st annual Inter Tribal Indian Ceremonial.

Some of the men around Stevenson, the Democratic presidential nominee, gathered about the same time at a news conference in Springfield. They were retiring party Chairman Frank McKinney, his successor, Stephen Mitchell, and Stevenson's personal campaign manager, Wilson Wyatt.

McKinney, who was appointed by

President Truman, said he feels as he sleeps down that he has accomplished party unity "100 per cent."

When a reporter asked whether Stevenson would have a "two-headed campaign," Mitchell and Wyatt were handpicked by Stevenson.

McKinney — "No, there won't be a two-headed campaign. There can be only one general and that is the national chairman."

Mitchell — "There is a commander-in-chief and the others work for him. Gov. Stevenson is the commander-in-chief."

Wyatt — "The campaign is under the direction of the governor — and there is only one general."

Tomorrow, Stevenson goes to Washington for a visit with President Truman and the cabinet. It may then be determined how big a role the President will play in the campaign.

On other fronts: Democratic Sen. A. S. Mike Monroney of Oklahoma proposed that the White House offer both presidential nominees a daily briefing on Korea and other world hot spots.

CIO Secretary James B. Carey, in a CBS television interview, said James A. Farley and other Democratic leaders backed vice president Alben Barkley's bid for presidential nomination to "use" and then "dump" him.

Farley quickly retorted that he had been sincerely for Barkley as the best man to unite the party.

Farley said he is "just as wholehearted" now in support of Stevenson.

Bradley Notes NATO Failure

WASHINGTON (AP) — A health study shows the nation's death rate dropped nearly 45 per cent during the first half of this century while life expectancy increased.

"All ages have shared in the improvement in health," said a book published yesterday by the Brookings Institution, a private research organization.

The 1900 death rate of 17.2 per 1,000 persons was compared with 9.6 per 1,000 in 1950. A decline was noted in diseases like pneumonia and similar respiratory maladies, but increases were recorded for disorders like cancer and other malignant tumors.
