Chinese General, Blonde Five Million Dollars Sit Out Trial In Mexico City

MEXICO CITY (AP)—All hands settled down this week for a long extradition fight in the case of a Chinese general, five to 25 million dollars and a blonde secretary.

Nationalist China hired a former President of Mexico or the attorney to help it get back either Lt. Gen. Pang Tzu Mow or the millions it claimed he grabbed after having been given them to buy arms. Mow was formerly chief of a Chinese Air Force purchasing mission in Washington. In an earlier suit, filed there, the Chinese Kail-shuek government claimed he failed to account for \$25,890,599 of Air Force procurement funds, including some seven millions.

Mow was held in the Department of Justice Building here while the Nationalist Chinese regime prepared formal demands for him. Also held was his tall, blonde American secretary, Agnes Kelley, a former night club entertainer.

With them in jail were Oliver M. Kinloch, an American who has been living here, and Pedro Casas Acha, a Mexican. They were nabbed Saturday in Cuernavaca, where Mow has been living since he left the U. S. earlier this year.

Atty. Gen. Luis Felipe Canudas said Mow has been accused by the Chinese nationalists of "improperly abstracting documents, defrauding the government and the robbery of more than five million dollars." The others are charged as accomplices. Canudas added.

Mow told reporters he was innocent of any wrong doing. His arrest, he said, was due to a "political row." He claimed his government had brought the Washington suit because "I was beginning to show up too many irregularities." He gave no further explanation.
