New SP Track Dedicated

EUGENE (AP) — A 90-car Southern Pacific freight Friday became the first train to use the relocated railroad tracks around Lookout Point Dam on the Middle Fork of the Willamette River. A special car was hooked on the back of southbound freight train No. 6327, carrying Southern Pacific officials and representatives of the Corps of Engineers. The new tracks, built because the old right-of-way will be flooded by Lookout Point reservoir, cross two new rail bridges and follow the left side of the reservoir. Passengers have a good view of the new dam. Army Engineers handled the relocation work. Friday was the first day of a 10-day test period for the new tracks. On Aug. 25 the new right-of-way will be turned over to Southern Pacific.

Hog Slaughter Query Looms

SALEM (AP) — The question of who will pay for the hogs ordered slaughtered under a recent state quarantine order was given to Attorney General George Neuner Thursday to answer. State Agriculture Director E. L. Peterson issued the hog quarantine order last week in an attempt to stamp out an outbreak of vesicular exanthema which was being brought into the state by hogs imported from the Midwest. Peterson ordered the slaughter of two groups of hogs in Portland stockyards. The meat is fit for human consumption if it is cooked after being slaughtered. Federal funds are available to repay the hog owners for lost revenue, but the money may only be used if the state provides matching funds. Gov. McKay has asked Neuner for an opinion as to whether the state can use money from the emergency fund to match the federal allotment.

Phone Worker Wage Hike OK'd

PORTLAND (AP) — Wage increases ranging from \$3 to \$5 a week were approved Friday by representatives of the CIO Communications Workers of America and the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. The new contract which is to become effective Sunday—subject to union ratification—replaces one which expired Aug. 1. The union and company have been negotiating the agreement for the past two months. Company officials said parts of the wage increase will require wage stabilization board approval.
