Woman Held In Bank Case

DIERS, Ark. (AP) - Mrs. Opal Simmington, 49-year-old assistant cashier of the Bank of Diers, was known in this Southeastern Arkansas lumber town as a woman "everybody trusted." The attractive, dark-haired divorcee had been in charge of the bank's bookkeeping department for 20 years. She was also city treasurer. Today nearly \$73,000 of the bank funds were missing, the FBI reported. And Mrs. Simmington was charged with making false entries. She was arraigned yesterday before U. S. Commissioner Elmer Tackett of Hot Springs, Ark. After waiving preliminary examination, she was released in \$7,500 bond. The \$72,900 shortage in the bank's books was discovered by examiners of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation on Aug. 11. M. W. McFarlin, chief of the FBI at Little Rock, said evidence showed the books had been manipulated for almost 20 years. The FDIC examiners, FBI agents, a private auditing firm, and agents of the State Bank Commission worked throughout the night in efforts to clear up the situation. Employed by the bank for 32 years, Mrs. Simmington has been living with her mother, Mrs. Mattie Epperson, in a modest frame house. She was divorced about 15 years ago. Tom F. Westbrook, cashier and only other bank employe, said Mrs. Simmington was always "faithful in reporting for work."

Coast Improvement Project Said Top Highway Program

PORTLAND (AP) - A million and a quarter dollar improvement project on the Coast Highway near Depoe Bay topped the list of 14 jobs on which the State Highway Commission opened bids Monday. The Monday bids by counties: Baker—Construct 36 by 78 foot maintenance building at Baker; Love Building Service, La Grande, \$40,737. Columbia—Grade 5 of a mile and of 3.57 miles on Beaver ammunition storage point project on county roads three miles east of Clatskanie; John R. Saxton, Clatskanie, \$32,110. Coos—Construct box culvert at North Slough on Hauser-Coos Bay section of Coast Highway; Tom Lill-Depeo Bay topped the list of 14 jobs on which the State Highway Commission opened bids Monday. Douglas—Construct two 143-foot concrete viaducts on Oakland Junction-Deady unit of Pacific Highway near Oakland; Hamann Brothers Co., Portland, \$60,080. Jackson—Construct traffic signals at four intersections in Eugene; C. & S. Electric Co., Eugene, \$8,315. Lincoln—Grade and pave 4.62 miles of the Depoe Bay-Miner Creek unit of the Coast Highway; Pundarik and Stoen, Sutherlin, \$246,074. Marion—Construct 28 by 104-foot maintenance building at Salem Highway Shops; Enoch Maerz, Salem, \$13,990. Polk—Pave 37 of a mile of west approach to Salem bridge on Salem-Dallas Highway; Warren Northwest, Inc., Portland, \$14,960. Polk—Grade and pave 33 of a mile of Glen Creek Road-S. P. Railroad section of Salem-Dayton Highway in West Salem; Warren Northwest Inc., Portland, \$25,860. West Defense Test Secret

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - An Army spokesman said Monday that results of the first joint military-civilian defense exercise in eight Western states was a "classified" secret. "We are not going to tell Joe Stalin the results," the spokesman said of the week-end exercise. A civilian defense spokesman also said the military had restricted information about the results. The exercise was a "paper operation" only, and was designed for the protection and welfare of the civilian population.

New Drug For Pneumonia

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - A new drug called erythromycin which has proved effective against resistant strains of pneumonia was described yesterday at the centennial convention of the American Pharmaceutical Association. Robert C. Anderson of Eli Lilly and Co. in whose Indianapolis, Ind., laboratories erythromycin was developed, said the drug will supplement such earlier antibiotics as penicillin and aureomycin. It has proved effective, he said, against several types of pneumonia and staphylococcus infections which previously had either not been affected by known drugs or which had developed a resistance to them.
