DUROCHER OUT AGAIN

Giants' Chances Dwindle

Time keeps running out and trouble keeps piling up on the harried, injury-riddled and undermanned New York Giants.

Trailing the runaway Brooklyn Dodgers by a 14 1/2-game margin, the defending National League champions no longer arrived in Chicago yesterday for their final Western swing of the year when they were handed another severe jolt.

A telegram from League President Warren Giles advised Leo Durocher that he had been suspended for five days for his rumpin' with umpire Augie Donatelli last Sunday. A 10-day fine also was levied on the stormy manager of the Giants.

Durocher, recognized as one of the best managers in baseball, generally was credited with doing a magnificent job last season in leading the Giants to their first flag in 14 years. For bringing the team up from a 13 1/2-game deficit as late as Aug. 11, he earned the Manager-of-the-Year award in the Associated Press poll.

There were many who believed Durocher was doing an even better job of managing this year in keeping the Giants in second place despite such crippling blows as the ankle fracture suffered by Monte Irvin, the loss of Willie Mays to the service, the back ailment of Bob Maglie and the slump of Hal Thompson of 1961 playoff fame.

Cut Beats Snapper In Ninth

BOISE — Ural (Jack) Snapp, Merrill, Ore., middleweight, lost a ninth-round technical knockout to Garth Panter of Dayton, Ind., in the 10-round main event at Boise's Bronco Stadium last night.

Snapp received a gash on his forehead in the ninth and the ringside physician called a halt to the proceedings.

Until that point the Oregon fighter had surprised the crowd of 2,000 by demonstrating a left hand that unnerved the Dayton strong boy.

Snapp kept the left in Panter's face almost continuously through the fight, and completely closed Panter's eye. The Merrill boxer opened up with both hands in the seventh and eighth rounds, and in the ninth, during a fast flurry of punches in Snapp's corner, he came out with a split forehead.

Fists Raised During Leo's Beef With Ump

CHICAGO (AP) — Manager Leo Durocher of the New York Giants has been suspended for five days for a rumpin' with umpire Augie Donatelli during last Sunday's game against the Boston Braves.

The suspension, announced yesterday by National League President Warren Giles, hit the Giants a stiff blow in their race to overtake the league-leading Brooklyn Dodgers.

Durocher, who cannot return to the helm until Aug. 23, will miss six games — two doubleheaders against the Chicago Cubs tomorrow and Thursday and two games against the St. Louis Cardinals Friday and Saturday.

Fain, Musial Eye Crowns

NEW YORK (AP) — Batting champions Ferris Fain of the Philadelphia Athletics and Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals are teaming up to perform a feat no previous pair has been able to accomplish in 38 years.

Not since 1914 when Ty Cobb of Detroit annexed his eighth consecutive hitting title and Jake Daubert, the old Brooklyn first baseman, captured his second in a row, have both batting kings retained their crowns the following year.

Fain, who led the American League in 1951 with a .344 average, tops the loop with .333, seven points better than New York's Gene Woodling in second place with .326. Musial, seeking his third straight batting crown, is the National League pace-setter with a .326 mark. The slender outfielder, a .355 hitter last season, holds an 11-point edge over runnerup Ted Kluszewski of the Reds, whose average is .315.
