Phil Murray Gets Raise
PITTSBURGH — The CIO United Steelworkers has given its president, Philip Murray, a pay raise from \$25,000 to \$40,000.

Other top officials of the million-member union also got raises from the USW Executive Board which ended a two-day session here Wednesday.

Murray was said to have asked a smaller raise, just enough to maintain the \$5,000 difference between his pay and that of the union's other two international officers.

They are James G. Thimmes, vice president, and David J. McDonald, secretary-treasurer, each of whom was boosted \$10,000 to \$25,000 a year.

Margaret Says: 'It's All A Big Misunderstanding'

HELSINKI, Finland (AP) — "I believe it must all have been a simple misunderstanding," Margaret Truman said today.

That was Margaret Truman's statement at a news conference Thursday over the ruckus kicked up by Swedish newspapers over alleged "tough-guy" tactics used in Stockholm by her bodyguards.

The President's daughter had other descriptions, too, such as "much ado about nothing," and "it was really silly" about accounts in Stockholm newspapers such as the one published by Expressen, which said the bodyguards — members of the U. S. Secret Service — flung aside a photographer who tried to take Miss Truman's picture at Stockholm's central station.

As for that account, Miss Truman suggested that perhaps the photographer involved did not understand English.

Miss Truman stressed that she had been supplied with a bodyguard not on her own wish but because a U. S. law stipulates that members of the President's family must always be protected by such guard.

She said that no member of her entourage had ever forbidden pictures being taken of her.

Back home, Margaret's father defended the Secret Service men in reply to a news conference question of whether he would send new instructions telling them how to conduct themselves.

That is not necessary, Truman replied tersely. He added that Secret Service men need no instructions, that they are always right.

He gave a no comment reply to requests for a statement on the Swedish incident. He did say that he had read reports of the affair as they came to him.

Miss Truman arrived here Thursday on her European tour. Photographers snapped as many pictures as they wanted while her three-member bodyguard remained discreetly in the background. She plans a two-day stay in Finland, newspaper, Sweden's biggest newspaper, called the Secret Service men "scorlions."

It said they were uncouth and intercepted Swedes who wanted to pass "any place where it pleases Miss Truman to be at a given moment."

Then Aftonbladet flung a barb: "Miss Truman is not in danger of her life in Stockholm. . . We understand that she is not going to sing here."
