Nixon Plans to Support McCarthy Election Drive

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Richard M. Nixon of California made it clear Friday he will support Sen. Joseph McCarthy of Wisconsin for re-election, if McCarthy is re-nominated and asks Nixon's backing. Nixon, the Republican vice presidential nominee, replied to published reports that he would shun McCarthy with a statement issued through his office. "I am going to assist in the election of Republican members of the House and Senate wherever the opportunity presents. When the voters pick a nominee, I will accept the decision and abide by it in any state."

Harriman Out As Candidate

NEW YORK (AP) — Averell Harriman has accepted the chairmanship of the Democratic party's New York State Convention here next week and withdrawn as a senatorial possibility. Harriman announced his decision yesterday, after Democratic State Chairman Paul E. Fitzpatrick made a letter asking Harriman to preside at the convention. At the convention, on Aug. 28, the Democrats will choose their candidate for U. S. senator from New York. Fitzpatrick said he asked Harriman, mutual security director, to take the chairmanship post after consultation with state party leaders. In accepting the invitation, Harriman said, "I cannot run for the Senate as the chairmanship position bars me from running."

Karl Mundt of South Dakota that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, the GOP presidential nominee, will support McCarthy's bid for re-election. Mundt is co-chairman of the Republican Campaign Speakers' Bureau. Monroney is chairman of the Democratic Speakers' Bureau. Mundt said in a radio program (MRS) Thursday night that Eisenhower will "endorse and campaign actively" for McCarthy, whose Communists in government charges have stirred up a political storm. Nixon's associates emphasized the vice presidential candidate will not take any part in party primaries, reserving his endorsement for candidates who have been nominated and who then ask his backing. Nixon has no Wisconsin appearance scheduled before the state's Sept. 9 primary but expects to speak there later. More more more more more more
