**Dorothy Kirby Is Medalist**

 PORTLAND — Straight-shooting Dorothy Kirby of Atlanta, having mastered 146 rivals to capture medal honors, watched the formal defense of her Women's National Amateur Golf championship Tuesday.

The tall, drawing girl from Georgia scored a three-over par 76 to lead the qualifiers Monday. It was the second time Miss Kirby had won medalist honors. She did it in the 1948 tournament at Tulsa.

The surviving field of 46 took up Tuesday in the first round of match play. The tournament course, Waverley Country Club, measures 6,323 yards, par 35-37-72.

Par was an elusive target for the girls Monday and only six managed to break 60.

Miss Kirby, paired against Mrs. Frank Fisk of Portland in the first round, had only two sixes on her card in a day that saw the board

**Raffensberger Owns NL Earned Run Lead**

NEW YORK — Lefty Ken Raffensberger of the Cincinnati Reds, who turned in a six-hit shutout against the New York Giants last night, has taken over as the National League's earned run leader.

Averages compiled by The Associated Press through yesterday's games disclose that the 35-year-old Raffensberger has allowed 58 earned runs in 208 innings for a 2.51 mark. The veteran Redleg hurler has a 14-11 record.

In the American League, Philadelphia's Bobby Shantz, with 46 earned tallies in 229 frames, holds the top spot with a 1.81 average. The brilliant southpaw, seeking to capture pitching's triple crown, has won 22 and dropped only four for the four-place Athletics.

Karl Drews and Robin Roberts, a pair of Philadelphia righthanders, follow close behind Raffensberger in the National League. Drews, who boasts five shutouts, has permitted 43 earned runs in 171 innings, for a 2.53 state while Roberts, the N. L.'s only 20-game winner, is third at 2.56. Robin's

record shows 71 earned runs in 259 innings.

Allie Reynolds, the early season ERA leader in the American League, still has a chance to overtake Shantz. The 34-year-old New York Yankee righthander, with 47 earned runs in 193 frames, is running with a 2.19 average.

Cleveland's Mike Garcia holds down third place at 2.36. The durable righty, who shows a 16-8 record, has given up 69 earned runs in 229 innings.

 Hollywood and Oakland continue to lead the Pacific Coast League but only the California boosters are smiling at Seattle and Portland as the pennant race enters the home stretch.

Seattle takes on third place San Diego this week while Portland tangles with Sacramento. And both could narrow the margin separating them from the league leaders.

Seattle is five games behind the weakening Padres as the teams open a series at Seattle, and Portland — the Rainiers' nemesis all season — trails the Queen City nine by only half a game going against the tailing Sacramento Solons.

Seattle and San Diego were scheduled Monday night but the game was rained out. A double-header was scheduled Tuesday with Guy Fletcher, an old Seattle moundman, facing veteran Al Widmar in the opener.

Portland manager Clay Hopper tapped Lyman Linde to oppose Glenn Elliott at Sacramento.

Hollywood is scheduled against Los Angeles at Hollywood and Oakland will face San Francisco in Seals' Stadium.

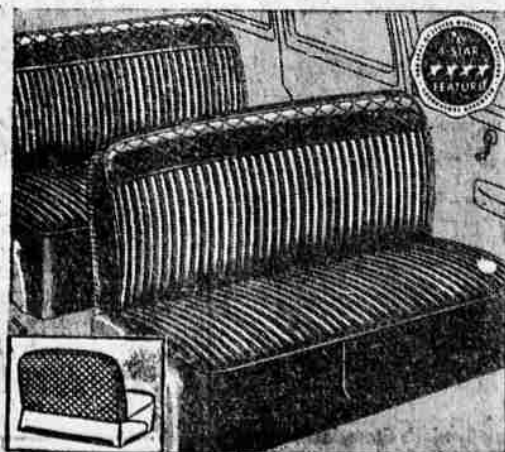
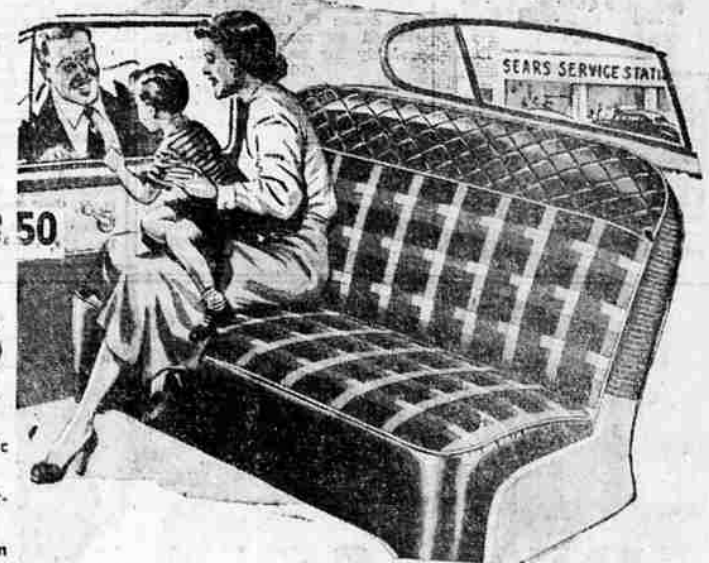
