Seattle took a pair of games from San Diego in Pacific Coast League play Tuesday night to move within two games of the third-place Padres. But Portland's drive for a first division berth was set back by a loss to last place Sacramento.

The Rainiers dumped the sagging Padres 4-3 and 9-6 to stretch their latest winning streak to five straight. Sacramento edged Portland 3-1 in a hurling duel between Glenn Elliott of the Sacs and the veteran Red Adams.

Seattle put on a four-run second inning to win the first game of its doubleheader, featured by homers by Walt Judnich of Seattle and Jack Graham of San Diego, but an eight-run uprising in the second inning of the nightcap routed Padre hurler Theotic Smith and put the Pads in a hole.

Eddie Bockman's homer in the seventh, a walk in the ninth to Bob Sturgeon, Bob Dillinger's sacrifice, Dino Resnelli's single, an infield out and Frankie Austin's error accounted for the Sacramento runs. Adams allowed the Sacs only four hits and Elliott permitted only five.

Oakland gambled on Harry Schaeffer, a southpaw sent it by the New York Giants, and manager Mel Ott had to yank him after San Francisco had scored three runs in the first two innings. The Seals went on to win the game 5-2.

Hollywood pounded out 12 hits against only six by Los Angeles, but the Angels scored five runs on two homers and beat the league leaders, 6 to 5.

**Mulligan Nixes New Ballpark**  
PORTLAND (AP) — Bill Mulligan, general manager of the Portland Beaver baseball team, thinks the club should not build a new ball park now.

The federal government recently announced that it planned to lift its ban on recreational construction next April. That would clear the way for building the long-planned stadium.

But Mulligan said Tuesday that high cost of materials and labor plus the general decline in baseball attendance were two reasons for postponing construction. He said the present stadium had been rebuilt to meet fire regulations.
