Russian Newspaper Studies Proposed New Communist Congress

MOSCOW (AP)—Pravda announced Tuesday it is launching "both positive and critical" articles on the proposed changes in party statutes coming before the All-Union Party Congress Oct. 5. The official newspaper said it was doing this in accordance with the Central Committee of the USSR Communist Party.

charges in the party statutes, beginning wherever possible in the primary party organizations. The lowest units of the party structure. The Central Committee decreed "full freedom of criticism" for this discussion, with the party press making its pages available for comment.

By fostering this "discussion," the Communist rulers also reassert the proposition that no Communist—barring, of course, the handful of leaders around Stalin himself—is immune from criticism. It is a means of additional control by the dictatorship from the center. It is no sign whatever of increased party democracy, but rather of the reverse.

At a critical juncture in world affairs, the Kremlin evidently has found it necessary to batten the hatches against any eventuality on the international scene, up to and including the possibility of general war. The production schedule of the fifth five-year plan announced for "adoption" by the party congress indicates the Kremlin is a long way from considering itself economically ready for a widespread conflict.

Early Oregon Eisenhower Supporters Bitter Over Choice of New Leaders

SALEM (AP)—The men who launched the Eisenhower-for-President boom in Oregon are plenty sore about being detailed into the background of the campaign.

It has caused a Republican party rift that might be an indication that if Eisenhower is elected, Gov. Douglas McKay won't be the man to dispense federal patronage.

William L. Phillips, Salem auto dealer, was chairman of the state Eisenhower organization, and State Rep. Mark Hatfield, also of Salem, was its secretary.

The announcement of a widespread discussion in the Soviet Communist Party has always been a danger signal. It causes Communists, from upper echelons all the way down the line, to walk with great caution. The discussion is a vehicle with which the party has often hoodwinked members into speaking their minds—only to find later they had gone counter to the views of the Kremlin rulers. Egypt Asks For Weapons

CAIRO (AP)—Egypt's reform government has asked the United States to supply automatic weapons for an increased mobile police force.

Premier Aly Maher also appeared for American economic aid and technical advice to help raise the country's living standard. Maher announced the requests last night after conferring with U. S. Ambassador Jefferson Caffery and Maj. Gen. Mohammed Naguib, leader of the Army coup which ousted ex-King Farouk.

A few months ago the U. S. supplied Egypt with enough automatic weapons to set up a mechanized police regiment of 3,000 men. It is understood the government plans to increase this force to 5,000.
