Senate Sub-Committee Accuses Radio, TV Writers of Communism

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Senate sub-committee report said today that pro-Communist script writers are spreading "subtle" propaganda over the nation's radio and television airwaves.

"The thing is subtle," the report of the Senate internal security sub-committee quoted script writer Ruth Adams Knight as testifying at closed door hearings.

Miss Knight, denouncing Communists and communism, said pro-Communist script writers stop short of "laying down the party line" in their program scripts, but skillfully weave into them "a constant denigration of the capitalistic system."

Barbey Asks Troop Call

PORT LEWIS, Wash. (AP)—Civil defense "whistleblowers" and troops will be called out for future defense training exercises if recommendations of the Washington State director of civil defense are accepted.

The director, D. E. Barbey, was among the 63 civilian and military officials from the Pacific Northwest and Canada who attended a civil defense critique here Tuesday.

First Degree Murder Filed

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP)—Acting Dist. Atty. Elwood Rich says he will file first degree murder charges today against John Chauncey Lawrence 37, held in the slaying of Kathryn Knodel, 16, Lawrence's niece.

New TV System Gives Track Officials Closer Look At Ponies

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J. (AP)—A new television system that will give stewards at racetracks a close-up view of the complete running of all races, plus a quick film for any needed play-back, will get its first test today at the Atlantic City race course.

Eventually, the system may be extended throughout the sprawling racetracks so customers in dining rooms, club houses and grandstands, lounges, bars and other places can witness the races from large TV screens.

The TV plan, going the present motion picture system of recording races, one better, is being tested by RCA engineers and is similar to that used in atomic research and industrial plants.

Speed is the keynote of the TV-film recording system. Cameras located at strategic points around the track will follow the race with their telescopic eyes, and a coaxial cable will bring the picture to a TV screen in the stewards' stand.

Simultaneously, the TV picture will be processed on cine-film and in event of a foul claim or inquiry by the stewards on some incident in the race, the record will be available in less than a minute. The film can be projected, and slow motion will indicate the culprit, if any, as is done with the present filming of races at some tracks. Advocates of the TV system, however, point out the value of stating some delays.

English Work On TV-Phone

LONDON (AP)—The "Sorry, dear, but I'm working late at the office" dodge may be on the way out—TV-telephone has arrived.

The "I can see you" phone—latest invention of British radio engineers—is a surprise exhibit at London's annual radio show, which opened today.

The caller's image is shown on a television screen at the other end of the circuit, and the caller similarly can see the party on the other end on a television screen in front of him.

A spokesman for the phone makers said it was hoped that TV-telephone would be installed on the New York-London transatlantic line before long.

"It would be invaluable for high-level inter-governmental talks when people speaking must be certain of each other's identity," he suggested.

But the TV-phone won't be invading the privacy of the home for a while yet—the present model stands as high as a kitchen cabinet and costs around \$2,850.

British Claim Best Fighter

LONDON (AP)—Britain says she has the "most effective fighter plane in the world," a triangle-shaped jet called the Gloster Javelin.
