Today's Women

When Rita Hayworth does the Dance of the Seven Veils in her forthcoming picture, "Salome," there will be wolf calls audible from Portland, Maine, to Portland, Oregon.

The flaming Rita, of course, can take the bows, but there should be a few for the young women who conceived the sensational dance and worked for weeks with Miss Hayworth to polish every movement.

She is Valerie Bettis, a glamor girl herself, who was born in Texas and has won wide acclaim both as a choreographer and as a dancer in such Broadway hits as "Inside USA," "Great to Be Alive" and "Bless You All." Incidentally, she is making her film debut as the "other woman" in the current Hayworth picture, "Affair in Trinidad."

Miss Bettis, who looks, acts and talks like a juvenile Tallulah Bankhead, was hired by Columbia to stage Rita's dances and wound up playing a part in the picture when an alert casting director spotted her on the set.

Figuring out the "Dance of the Seven Veils" was no small chore, says Valerie, since the Hollywood version of "Salome" differs drastically from the familiar Oscar Wilde conception. Hollywood makes Salome a nice girl, who does her famous dance to save the life of John the Baptist instead of demanding his head on a platter. Says Valerie:

"Working out the Dance of the Seven Veils with no head and no platter was, as you can see, a sharp break with tradition. But we did it."

SUBTLE In the dance Rita wears the seven veils, all right, and each is a different color. Here Valerie did some neat calculating, too, making the outer veil black, and progressing through the cool colors such as peacock blue and purple, through the flame tones to the final veil, which is, match, flesh colored.

Valerie does not appear in "Salome," but the mark of her genius is plainly visible in the spectacular choreography. She gives full credit to Rita, however, saying:

"Rita is a natural dancer. Her arm and hand movements particularly are pure music. She has a rhythmic sense which is a joy to a dance director. And my original conception of the dance, of course, is adapted to her own personality."

How does Miss Bettis work out a new dance routine? She isn't quite sure, but says:

"Usually I just sit and brood, and listen to the music, and then all at once I see it."

"I work out some of the routines myself, and then work with the star, so that in the end the dance is a blend of what I thought of first and the star's interpretation of it."

TRY THIS

Next time you bake a piece of corned pork give it this nectar glaze. Combine 1 cup apricot whole fruit nectar with 1-3 cup brown sugar and 2 teaspoons cornstarch. Cook until clear and thickened. Slick the scored fat of the hot baked meat with cloves and cover with the sauce. Bake 20 minutes or more in a moderately hot oven until nicely glazed.

Here's the way to cut bread well: Use a very sharp knife; keep the blade of the knife keen by frequent sharpening and by placing the knife in a rack when it is not in use. Cut slices of even thickness. If very thin slices are needed, chill the bread wrapped in wax paper before cutting.
