Youth Leaders Slate Meeting

Nationally known leaders in the field of education, health and welfare will come to Oregon for the Governor's Second Conference on Children and Youth to be held in the state capital, September 29-30, 1952.

The conference, first to be held in Oregon since the Mid-Century White House Conference will have as its general theme, "Oregon's Children—How Democratic Leadership Functions in Community Planning for Children and Youth."

One of the top speakers will be Martha M. Eliot, M. D., new Chief of the United States Children's Bureau, Washington, D. C. Dr. Eliot is well known to all who work with or for children. For the last two years she has been an Assistant Director-General of the World Health Organization. Before that Dr. Eliot was for 25 years on the staff of the Children's Bureau, 15 of those years she served as Assistant or Associate Chief.

After joining the staff of the Children's Bureau, Dr. Eliot for 10 years directed the bureau studies

on the growth and development of children. She became Assistant Chief of the Bureau in 1934, and Associate Chief in 1941. In these capacities she headed the health and medical services of the bureau which include the maternal and child health and crippled children's programs under the Social Security Act.

In 1949, Dr. Eliot became an Assistant Director-General of WHO. There she gave new impetus to development of public-health services in countries asking for help from WHO.

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Aussie Wool Sets Prices

NEW YORK—Makers of men's and women's wool clothing are eyeing Australia keenly this week. The way the price cat finally jumps at the raw wool auctions there may have a lot to do with the price of your next spring's suit.

Some wool fabric manufacturers here think the first sales at Sydney showed a firm enough tendency for the American mills to set prices for next spring's women's wear lines at about the same level as last spring. The lines formally open around the middle of this month.

Others contend it is too early yet to tell how the Australian auctions are going. American buying in Sydney has been very sketchy so far. Most of the wool offered has been of a quality not sought here.

Many fabric makers, therefore, are holding up the pricing of spring lines, even though many of them have enough wool already bought at the old price. The way the price goes in Sydney will still have its effect, they say.

Australian wool prices started out higher on the opening day Monday, then slipped, and are now reported about the same as when the auctions there closed in June.

Among the other announcements at the assembly was the price hike in student body cards from four to five dollars. Matt DeFatti, business manager of the high school, explained that the price hike is to partially cover the price of insurance for the boys who go out for sports. For instance the price of insurance for football has been lowered from \$7.50 to \$1.50.

The marketing association is to begin its regular periodical shipments this weekend, Warren announced, with final contacts due today for cattle. Shipping date is to be Sept. 6, and marketing is to follow two days later. Shipments are to continue every two weeks hereafter.
