

Blackwell Wins for Yanks

New York Stretches Lead Over Cleveland

The New York Yankees received a quick dividend on their \$40,000 investment in Ewell Blackwell.

Five days after the purchase of the former National League star from the Cincinnati Reds, the Yankees last night sent Blackwell to the mound against the Boston Red Sox. The long, lean right-hander responded with a scoreless five-inning performance to rack up his first American League triumph.

Blackwell was not the overpowering pitcher he had been in his days as a big winner with the Reds, but he looked quite capable before bowing out for a pinch hitter. He permitted four singles, fanned four and walked three before retiring because of weariness and the humidity.

It was in the fifth, however, when the Yankees ranged up on Boston starter Sid Hudson for all their runs to tie the nightcap, 4-0.

After rookie Tommy Gorman had hurled an eight-hit 5-0 shutout over the Red Sox in the afternoon portion of the day-night doubleheader, FIVE STRAIGHT

The two triumphs ran the Yankees' winning streak to five and increased their first-place margin over the idle Cleveland Indians to 3½ games.

Brooklyn's Dodgers, the National League leaders, dropped a pair to Philadelphia's Phillies, 6-3 and 9-3, and were lucky to get out of the City of Brotherly Love in one place. Two dozen Philadelphia hits plus splendid pitching by right-handers Robin Roberts and Karl Drews cut the Dodgers' first-place lead over the idle New York Giants to eight games.

Chicago's White Sox climbed into fourth place, vanquishing the Detroit Tigers twice, 6-5 and 7-4.

Rocco Krschick's two-run triple in the ninth won the opener. Mary Grissom won his 11th in the nightcap.

WASHINGTON'S Senators, although held to three hits in each game,

won both ends of a two-night twin bill from Philadelphia, 3-2 in 10 innings and 5-0, to dump the Athletics into fifth place, only a half game in front of the Nats.

Mike Fornieles, 20-year-old Cuban right-hander, pitched a one-hit shutout in his major league debut for Washington. A second-inning single by catcher Joe Aschroth prevented the youngster from becoming the first pitcher in modern times to pitch a no-hitter in his first big league game.

Blackwell received credit for a shutout victory although he needed help from another National League castoff, Johnny Sain. The ex-Boston Braves' right-hander permitted only one hit in the last four innings.

TIED

Blackwell was a tired but happy fellow in the Yankees' clubhouse after the game.

"I lost nine pounds," he said, "but it was worth it. The arm feels fine. I was nervous out there on the mound but that was because I really wanted to win that one. I was bearing down all the time. I became tired after the fourth inning but only because I hadn't pitched since Aug. 9."

"I'm sure I'll be all right from now on in. I'm ready to take my regular turn."

Manager Stengel wisely sent in a pinch hitter to bat for Blackwell when the Yankees loaded the bases on Hudson in the fifth. Johnny Mize, the pinch swinger, popped out but Mickey Mantle came through with a two-out single that drove in two runs and broke up the scoreless duel. Phil Rizzuto's single sent the other two runs over the plate.

The Dodgers never had a chance as the Phils broke through for six runs in the first three innings of each game. Roberts notched his 22nd win and his fifth over the Brooklyn in the opener. Drews, another Dodger killer, won his 13th and his fourth over the league leaders in the nightcap.

Miss Sampson didn't get started until yesterday because she was busy beating Mary Ann Ellenberger of San Diego for the girls title last week. So she got busy and

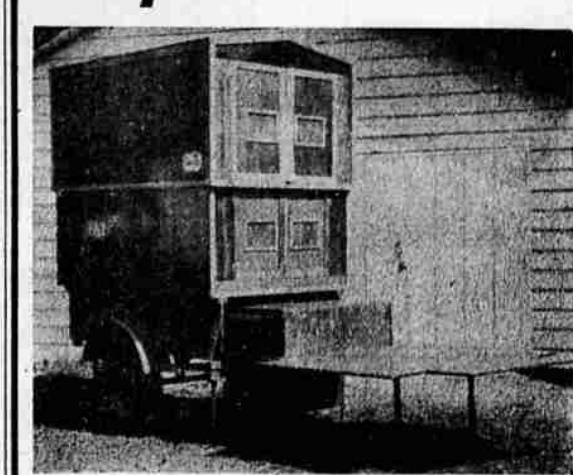
Neyland Quits As Director

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Spokane's Win Skein Now at 9

The Spokane Indians continued their late-season drive for their second straight Western International League baseball pennant Tuesday night, edging Victoria 2-1 for their ninth victory in as many starts.

The win cut Victoria's first-place margin to seven games.

The Indians, who passed Vancouver in the closing weeks last year to take the bunting, retained a mathematical chance of repeating against Victoria in 1952.

Both the Indians and the Tyes have 13 games on their schedule, six of them against each other. Spokane also must play last place Wenatchee and third place Vancouver. Victoria has games with Salem and Lewiston, in fourth and fifth place, respectively.

Lewiston tightened its grip on fifth place Tuesday night with a 7-5 victory over Vancouver's faltering Caplanos, while Salem, driving for Vancouver's berth, dropped Tri-City 4-2. Yakima whipped Wenatchee 6-1 in the loop's fourth game.

Jehosie Heard, the league's No. 1 hurler with 23 wins to his credit, started for Victoria but was relieved in the eighth by Bill Pryor. Spokane won the game in that inning when Pryor hit Wilbur Johnson, with the bases loaded, to force in the deciding marker.

Heard pitched six-hit ball during his stint on the mound, while John Conant, picking up his 17th win, allowed only five safeties.
