Scientists Perfect Artificial Lens For Eye

CHICAGO (AP) — Little Plastic lenses are being put into human eyes, replacing eye lenses lost through cataracts.

Dr. Harold Ridley of London, England, reported this new step today to the International College of Surgeons.

Cataracts are a cloudiness over the eye lens. They reduce vision, or blind.

The eye specialist takes out the clouded lens, and substitutes a little disc of a clear, pure plastic.

The lightweight plastic almost floats in the eye, and the patient doesn't feel it there. It is held in place by the iris, which is a muscle, and a membrane in back of the normal lens. The plastic lens does the same job.

There is no distortion in vision, and no need for thick cataract spectacles that magnify highly, Dr. Ridley said. The patient can move his eyes to see things at his side. He can see through the plastic lens as soon as the bandages are removed.

Truman Asks Aid Program

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman called Thursday for the nation to broaden its programs in aid of the physically handicapped, "until they are big enough to give the proper help to every one who needs it."

"We need lots of public participation and lots of private contribution in this work," he added in a speech to the President's committee on Employment of the Physically Handicapped.

Truman announced that the committee's first annual Physician's Award would go to Dr. Henry K. Kessler of Newark, N. J., as the doctor who made the greatest contribution during the year to the welfare and employment of the physically handicapped.

A member of the President's committee, Dr. Kessler is a former president of the International Society for the Welfare of Cripples and of the National Rehabilitation Association.

Truman awarded Nils S. Josephson of Franklin Park, Ill., the President's trophy for the "outstanding performance of the year" by a handicapped person.

Josephson, 31, president of the Paraplegics Manufacturing Co., was crippled for life while serving on a carrier in the Pacific.

With other wheelchair "graduates" of the Hines (Ill.) Veterans

Hospital, he formed his company in February, 1951, to make small electronic parts.

Truman said: "The going was tough. Orders were few. But the men persevered and today this enterprise is a real success."

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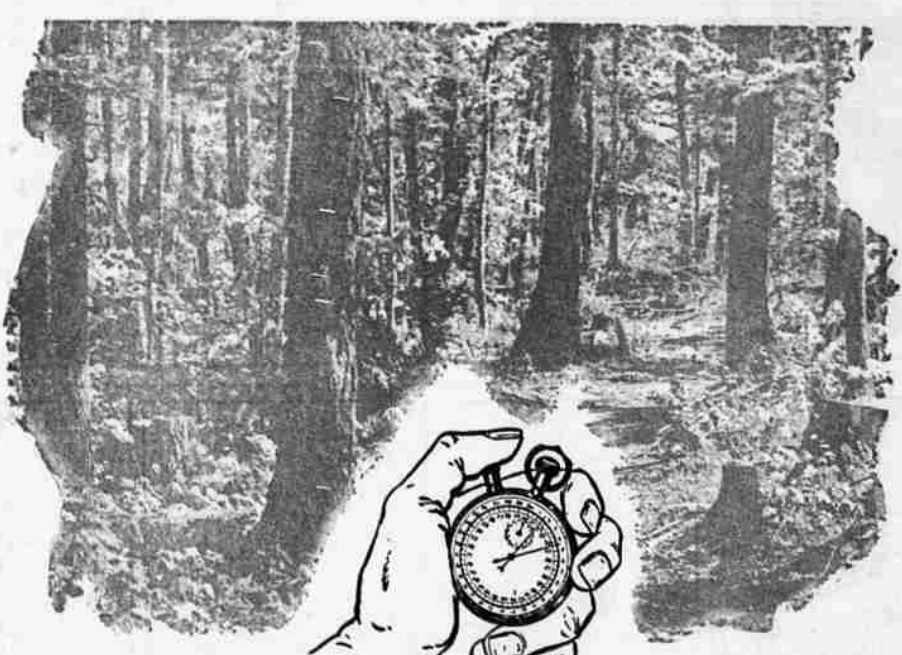
