

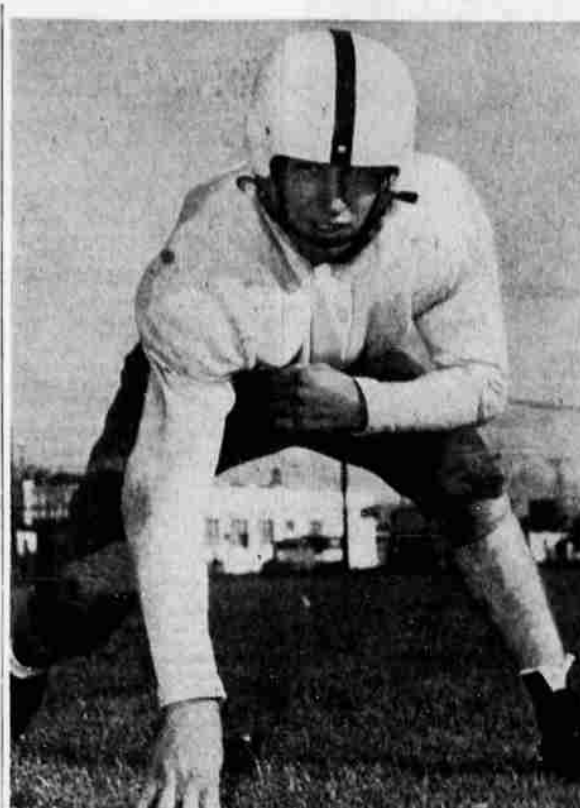

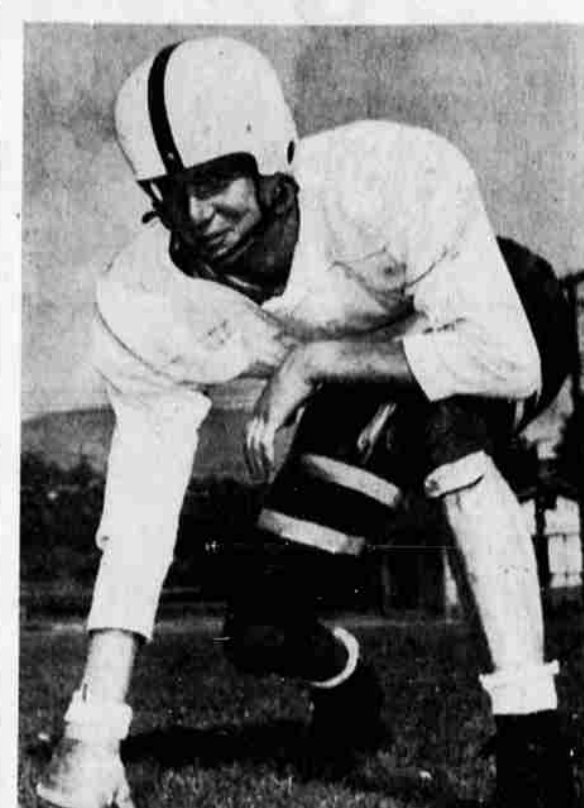

## PELICANS HAVE HORSES, THROWERS, DEPTH

It's been several seasons since the Pelican footballers have given fans the right to cheer. This could be the year followers of the Red and White team can break their long silence. Klamath Union High School's Pelicans acquired Tacoma's franchise and returned to the WFL this season after several years absence.

### Brenner Boosted

LEWISTON, Idaho — The Lewiston Broncos of the Western International League announced Thursday Bill Brenner, the Broncos' playing manager this year, will be general manager next season. James B. McMonagle, the Broncos president, said Brenner will be given a "substantial" salary increase. The salary was not disclosed.

Coach Bob Hendershott has the horses this season.

In addition, he has passers and big, hard-charging linemen.

And, more important, he has the depth, a definite improvement over last year when he had eleven and the rest were named Joe.

A transfer from Battle Ground, Wash., has Hendershott and Assistant Paul McCall and Len Surles in a tizzy. He's Bill Salt, a 158-pound quarterback who throws strikes with authority.

There are two other arms that will be kept busy when Salt isn't hitting targets. One belongs to Jim Dougherty, the other to Doug Pence.

Dougherty, who runs like he's going somewhere, can, and prob-

ably will, operate at fullback a good share of the time.

Fullback George (Butcher Boy) Hanson is back but he's looking more like an end in practice sessions and will probably see duty there a good deal of the time.

Two lettermen halfbacks are around for their last season.

One is Kenny Young, the only consistent ground-gainer in Klamath's drab 2-5-1 season last year.

The other is Cal Gilmore, who is running this year with more confidence and drive.

Two other lettermen backs have switched to the line. Dick Lundsten is getting acquainted with a guard spot; George Maskell, outstanding defensive halfback last season, is filling in at center but is getting a terrific argument from Sophomore Dennis Todd.

The other four lettermen — there are nine in all — are Guards Matthew Del Fatti and Vernon Pryor, Tackle Doug Campbell and

defensive end jobs. Horton works better offensively and could be joined by either Munsell or Hanson — or Wilcox.

Benny Lawver, a 241-pound transfer from Bonanza, and Jim Young, carrying less weight but enough at 199, are strong candidates to join letterman Campbell at the tackle positions.

Pryor, Del Fatti and Lundsten have guard problems solved, with Joe Thomas also on hand.

Others on the combined Pelican-junior varsity squad who may earn extra duty before the year is over include:
