A personal gift was presented to the bride elect, from the entire group.

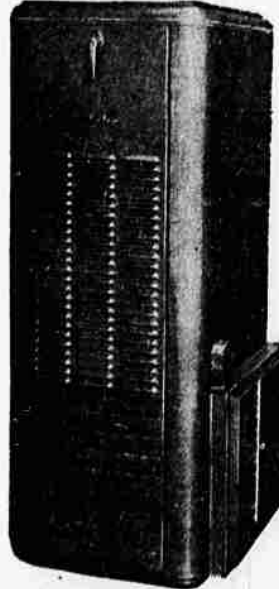
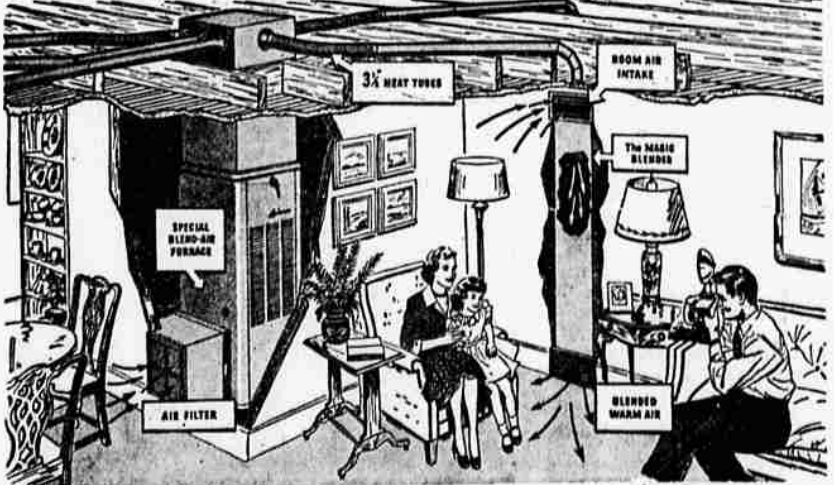
Visitors
