Power Cut Not Near

TACOMA — No immediate curtailment of electric power to industries of the Pacific Northwest is contemplated at the present, Jason Dryer, deputy administrator of the Defense Power Administration said here Thursday.

At a meeting of representatives of the Pacific Northwest Utilities Conference Committee, the DPA and the Bonneville Power Administration were discussed to insure power for essential public requirements.

Dryer declared that no one could forecast weather situations in coming months and therefore the group insists discussions could only take preparatory measures which would effect in case of a water shortage, effect in case of a water shortage, effect in case of a water shortage.

Principal discussion involved changing mechanics of operation of the western group of the Northwest power pool, which was set up to furnish power for Oregon and Washington.

Dryer asserted the group could not say which industries would be curtailed in case of an emergency as that decision was up to the DPA in Washington, D.C.
