### KF Selected For CIO Meet

PORTLAND (AP)—The Oregon CIO in a series of resolutions passed at its annual convention here Sunday, formally announced its stand on state ballot issues and presidential candidates.

As expected, the delegates endorsed the Democratic presidential ticket—Adlai Stevenson of Illinois, and Sen. John Sparkman of Alabama.

On state ballot issues, the CIO recommended:

Approval of changes in the milk control act to eliminate price controls at the retail level, and of reapportionment of the legislature.

Opposition to the Rev. William C. McCalmont, who is in the county jail at Auburn accused of grand theft in a \$22,408 swindle.
