

American Churchmen Plan Action Against Roman Edict

ROME (AP) — American Church of Christ leaders said Monday they planned court action against a police ban on their Protestant services in this seat of Roman Catholicism.

Cline R. Paden, of Brownfield, Tex., who heads the Rome Church of Christ, said, "We will do whatever is necessary to bring our case before the courts."

Police action against the sect in Italy was climaxed Sunday when worshippers defying the ban were barred by police from the church rooms in a Roman villa.

Later the services were held secretly in the home of a member whose name Paden declined to disclose because it "might hurt him."

Monday, a Church of Christ delegation called on the Italian Ministry of Interior to ask quick and favorable action on an application to hold services in Rome. Paden said the application was submitted last week.

An informed Italian source said the setback was due to the about 1,000 conversions since World War II — in Catholic Italy.

Paden protested to the Interior Ministry that the interference with the service violated guarantees in the Italian constitution of religious liberty, freedom of assembly and freedom of thought.

A ministry official replied that the Church of Christ did not have government permission necessary to hold services, a requirement that members of the sect said was enacted during Mussolini's Fascist regime.

Korean Women Held As Spies

PUSAN, Korea (AP) — South Korean police have arrested a band of 17 women spies operating from within the United Nations organization, the government announced today.

Police arrested 17 women, including two alleged ring leaders. The announcement followed by one day disclosure that a spy ring of 17 men had been broken up.

The two leaders were identified as Miss Pak Chung Ja, 35, and Miss Yoon Chul Sung, 24, both graduates of the Seoul Women's Medical College.

The government said Miss Pak received a special Communist training in North Korea. She returned to South Korea six months after the war began June 25, 1950, and has been working in a United Nations unit.

The government said Miss Pak and Miss Yoon befriended other South Korean women who had contacts with the U. S. forces and persuaded them to join the spy ring.

Lawyers Rap Slowness

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The nation's lawyers were told Monday that slowness in filling vacant federal judgeships has resulted in "intolerable delay" in justice during the past three years.

The Federal Judiciary Committee of the American Bar Association mentioned directly neither President Truman—who has the power to nominate judges—nor the U. S. Senate—which confirms the nominations—in its blast at "the appointing power."

However, in a report to the opening session of the 75th annual ABA convention, the committee traced the time lapsed between the dates of vacancies in wide sections of the country and the dates of presidential nominations to fill them.

It concluded its report by quoting without comment from a June, 1952 resolution adopted by federal judges of the Ninth Circuit (West Coast, Hawaii and Alaska) that "the impression has been created at the bar and with the public that federal judgeships are but a part of the patronage of politicians."

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Morse Slates AFL Speech

NEW YORK (AP) — Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) is scheduled to address the AFL convention here Thursday or Friday.

The AFL Executive Council extended an eleventh hour invitation to Morse Sunday night.

The invitation was extended after Morse indicated he would not campaign for Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for president.

Morse was reported by the New York Times to have accepted the invitation.

Morse, who previously had offered to campaign vigorously for Eisenhower, indicated his enthusiasm for the general had cooled, partly because Eisenhower has agreed with many of Sen. Robert A. Taft's views.

Eisenhower will address the AFL convention Wednesday and his Democratic opponent, Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson of Illinois, next Monday.

Phone Operators Forget Insult

STEVENSON, Wash. (AP) — Eight telephone operators, who walked off their jobs a week ago because of what they said was an insult, were back at work Monday.

They returned Saturday without receiving the apology they had demanded from the sponsors of a float in a recent county fair. The float portrayed Indiana's using smoke signals and indicated that was better than the telephone service in this town of 500.

SUCCESS SECRETS SOUGHT

NEW YORK (AP) — A group to study the secrets of business success has been formed by the presidents of 24 corporations from various parts of the country. Known as the Committee to Encourage Enterprise, it will survey ways to encourage risk capital to give small corporations more support.

John M. Fox, president of the Minute Mail Corp., is chairman. Fox said his group wants to combat the steady decline in formation of new corporations since 1940.

PENDLETON, Ore. (AP) — Shoot Webster, Lenepah, Okla., cowboy, Saturday night won his fourth consecutive Pendleton Round-Up championship.

He collected 66.1 points by winning first in a bulldozing round, two seconds in steer roping and a second in calf roping.

The victory gave him a leg on the new C. B. Jackson trophy. He retired the previous Jackson trophy last year after three consecutive wins.

Webster, apparently thinking he had not won, left the arena before he could be presented with the new trophy by Phil Jackson, publisher of the Oregon Journal.

Don Fore of Pilot Rock, Ore., won the steer roping contest. That gave him the \$500 J. J. Hamley memorial saddle.

Brahma bull riding—Steve Johnson, Long Beach, Calif.

Bob Robinson, Rockford, Idaho, won the Northwest bucking contest.

Taft Backs Sen. Lodge

BOSTON (AP) — Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge (R-Mass.) says he has the support of Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-Ohio) in his bid for reelection.

Lodge was one of the leaders in the movement to put Dwight D. Eisenhower into the presidential race and served as his pre-convention campaign manager.

Lodge said Taft had expressed his support of him in a letter to a Massachusetts voter. He said the letter was in response to reports that a "Taft for Kennedy" movement had the Ohio senator's approval.



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
