USDA Official Faces Fraud

WASHINGTON (AP) - A former Agriculture Department official and an Egyptian cotton importer to whom he is said to have furnished inside information Tuesday face charges of conspiracy to defraud the United States.

They are Clotis D. Walker and Loutfy Mansour. Indictments were returned against them Monday by a federal grand jury.

Walker was director of the cotton branch of the Agriculture Department's Production and Marketing Administration until last May 5 when he resigned a few days after the Senate Agriculture Committee investigated the case.

Mansour is the cotton importer, now reported to be at his home in Egypt. Federal officials said an effort would be made to bring him back for trial, but if this is not possible, Walker will be tried separately.

Conviction on the conspiracy charge could carry a maximum penalty of five years imprisonment and \$10,000 fine.

The indictment charged there was a conspiracy for Walker to furnish either personally or through Dyke Cullum, a Washington trader in commodities, secret and confidential information to Mansour concerning government plans to purchase Egyptian long staple cotton. Cullum was not named as a defendant in the indictment.

West Leans GOP

CALIFORNIA - Eisenhower would win by a slim margin, in the opinion of California editors, if the polls were open today. But the margin is so slender that the state is considered doubtful.

President Truman captured it four years ago, but by about 18,000 votes out of a total of 3,800,000.

The survey indicates Republicans are likely to take 31 counties, the Democrats 27.

The only Western State to go Republican in 1948 is considered by Oregon editors as likely to be a repeater in 1952.

These taking part in the survey provided estimates for 25 of 38 counties which will cast 90 per cent of the estimated vote.

Campaign developments could have an effect in Oregon, the editors indicate. Several all Republican, had said Eisenhower's campaigning was weak and Stevenson's efforts were making inroads among Eisenhower followers.

Honeymooners Found Killed

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) - A happy young couple, apparently with everything to live for, were found shot to death Monday in a lavish hotel penthouse. Puzzled officers conceded they haven't the slightest hint of a motive.

Dead are Adrian Lionel Grodnick, 19 son of a wealthy New York clothing manufacturer, and Betty M. Baron, 25, of Los Angeles. Sheriff's deputies put down the double deaths in the Flamingo Hotel as murder and suicide, although no notes were found.

They said apparently the pair were honeymooning, although they could find no record of their marriage. Friends and families had planned a formal wedding next Tuesday in Beverly Hills, Calif.

By telephone from New York, the young man's father, Samuel Grodnick, told deputies his son had moved to Los Angeles a few weeks ago in anticipation of the marriage, and that he soon was to go into the Army.

The senior Grodnick added that he had promised the couple a new home, a new Cadillac and a month's trip to the Virgin Islands as a wedding present.

Miss Baron was the daughter of William Baron, Los Angeles apartment house manager, and was a student at UCLA in 1949.

The bodies were discovered when hotel employees broke into the 325-a-day penthouse suite after failing to get response to ringing and knocking throughout the day.

Police said the girl had been shot twice through the head and Grodnick once behind the right ear. Near his right hand was a pistol.

Jet Helicopter Star Performer

TORRANCE, Calif. (AP) - A tiny aluminum helicopter, the "Jet Jeep," yesterday performed aerobics that surprised Secretary of the Army Frank Pace Jr. and others watching the demonstration.

The helicopter, the first public flight of American Helicopter Co.'s HX26, a one-man pulse-jet "copter" designed for military reconnaissance work.

Pilot Lou Hartwig zoomed straight up, swung back and forth in a figure-eight, hovered in the air, climbed on only one jet motor and descended to a graceful landing with both jets off.

The 300-pound craft has a small pulse jet engine at the tip of each rotor.

Mossy OKs Court Move

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) - Premier Mohammad Mossadegh told parliament Tuesday Iran is willing to let the World Court decide what compensation Britain should receive for her now-nationalized oil properties. He added, however, this is the only compensation Iran is prepared to pay.

The Mallis (lower house of Parliament) gave Mossadegh a 60 to 0 vote of confidence. It endorsed his previously announced rejection of a British-American plan for solution of the oil crisis and approved his counterproposals.

The iron-willed but hard-up premier on Aug. 30 rejected a settlement proposal made by President Truman and British Prime Minister Winston Churchill that called out a call for assistance, but later canceled the call after a check on for submission of the question of compensation to the World Court.

The joint Truman-Churchill offer, however, included submission of all claims and counter-claims of both parties to the international court sitting at The Hague, capital of The Netherlands.
