Patient Move Huge Effort

PORTLAND — It took the services of 100 persons, an airplane, two moving vans, an ambulance and considerable other equipment Tuesday to bring three polio patients from Pendleton to Portland.

The three, all stricken last month, are Ronald Lewis, 23; his sister-in-law, Mrs. Gloria Lewis, 23; and Mrs. Madeline Eckles, 31. They were flown to Portland in a Military Air Transport plane at the request of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

Lewis and Mrs. Eckles were in respirators. The plane was specially equipped to keep the electrically powered respirators in operation during the flight. After the plane landed, the respirators were moved by cranes into huge moving vans. The vans then took them to a Portland hospital where the patients will undergo physiotherapy. Mrs. Lewis, on a stretcher, traveled from the airport by ambulance.

The 100 persons who aided in the operation included men attached

to the Air Force base, medical personnel, police, firemen and technicians.

Truman Says GOP Plans Even Tougher T-H Law

NEW YORK — President Truman told the American Federation of Labor Tuesday that plans are afoot to "make the Taft-Hartley Law even more oppressive and unfair" to labor if the Republicans win in November.

In a message to the AFL's convention, the President said that "special interests are already grinning their axes for a fresh attack on labor in the event of a Republican victory."

He said he had "seen indications" that such "plans are afoot in Wall Street."

The message was read at a session at which W. Averell Harriman, Mutual Security administrator, was introduced at "the next secretary of state" by AFL President William Green.

Harriman, who at the Democratic convention in Chicago threw his delegate strength to Adlai Stevenson to help give him the nomination, has often been mentioned as a prospect for such an appointment if the Democrats win.

The AFL plans to endorse a presidential candidate. Tuesday morning, a lengthy resolution to give the endorsement to Stevenson was introduced into a committee on resolutions.

The three-page Truman message reviewed his seven-year administration in regard to labor, and said:

"We have suffered certain losses, but by and large, we have beaten back the main attacks and we have made real progress. I do not know what things will be like

in the future, but I am sure that they will be determined largely by the result of the election this year."

Truman said "not all Republicans are possessed by a hostility to labor" but he aimed a slap at Republican presidential candidate Dwight D. Eisenhower, who is scheduled to address the convention Wednesday.

"It appears," Truman said, "that the Republican candidate has now

made his peace with the author of the Taft-Hartley Law. Apparently, his conduct will not be out of line with the Republican platform, which, in my opinion is the most anti-labor platform they have submitted to the country in at least 16 years."

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GOP Member Turns Colors

PORTLAND — A second prominent Oregon Young Republican has announced support of Gov. Adlai Stevenson, the Democratic nominee.

She is Margie Bullard Taylor, who last year was secretary of the Oregon Young Republicans, Young GOP national committeewoman and College Co-chairman of the National Young Republican Federation.

She said she had joined the Volunteers for Stevenson because she had become disappointed with Gen. Dwight Eisenhower's campaign—particularly his support of Sen. Joseph McCarthy of Wisconsin and William Jenner of Indiana—and because she had become an admirer of Governor Stevenson.

Last week Steve Anderson, Salem attorney and a national GOP vice president, quit Eisenhower and joined Stevenson for the same reason.

On the other side, Oregon's first Democrats for Eisenhower Club was formed last week at Pendleton.

Governor's Wife To Launch Ship

ASTORIA — Mrs. Douglas McKay, wife of Oregon's governor, will break a bottle of champagne Saturday to launch the new 188-foot Navy minesweeper, the USS Dash.

The Dash is the first of five minesweepers which the Astoria Marine Construction Co. is building for the Navy.

It cost about five million dollars. Navy officers said, making it one of the most expensive ships, pound for pound, ever built for the Navy. All metal work on the ship is non-magnetic, they said.

State CIO Backs Racing Measure

PORTLAND — The Oregon State CIO recommended at its convention that Oregon voters defeat a ballot measure which would ban pari-mutuel betting on dog and horse races.

Union officials reported Tuesday that the resolution was approved at the closing session of the union's convention which ended here Sunday.

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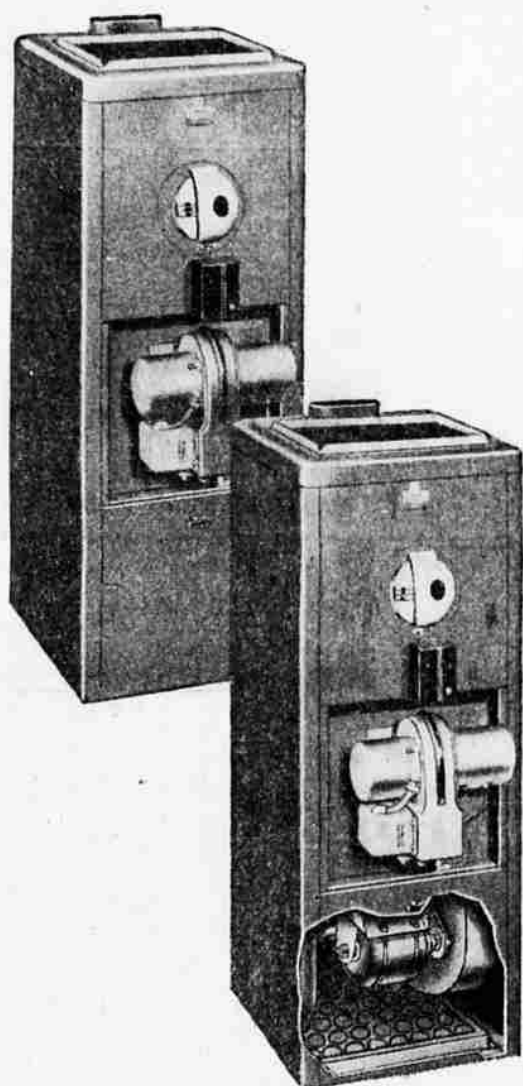
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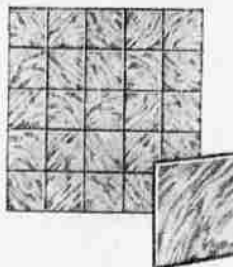
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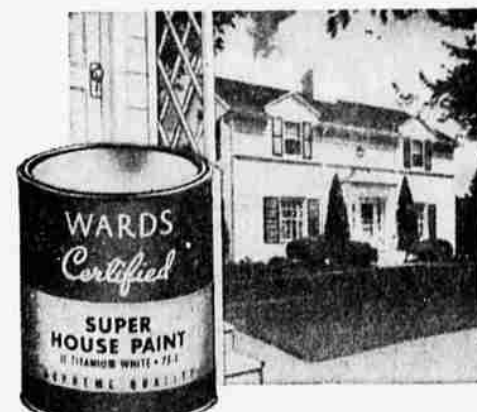


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
